## REPORT OF THE PRESIDENT

TO THE GOVERNORS OF THE JEWISH GENERAL HOSPITAL:-

YOUR Board of Administration has the honour to submit for your approval the Fourth Annual Report for the year ended December 31st, 1937.

Those of us who follow the progress of medicine and hospitals will be satisfied with the role which the Jewish General Hospital continues to fill in service to the Community and the contributions which it makes to medicine generally. During the year 55,095 days of hospital treatment were given to 4,359 patients in the 226 beds of our Hospital—the largest volume of service since the opening of the Hospital and representing near capacity occupancy in all departments.

Whilst we are pleased to have had our facilities so substantially utilized, we are especially proud of our continued record of service to the poor of every race and creed. Fully 75% of our work was devoted to the needy sick—a record which gives to all of us that great satisfaction which comes from the privilege of being associated with a hospital maintaining such a generous charitable service.

The demand upon the services of the Hospital continues to fill the public wards to the limit of their facilities and notwithstanding the fact that additional beds were pressed into use, we were unable to admit all who sought our services. Greater communal achievement imposes a collateral increase in responsibility and so serious thought must soon be given to extending our facilities if the urgent demands on the Hospital are to be fully met. I am confident that our people will respond to the call when the opportune time arrives.

It is gratifying to be able to report that due, in a large part to the greater number of private and semi private patients treated during the year our income from hospital operations has reached \$200,598.04. Expenditures for this period totalled \$258,651.55, resulting in an operating deficit of \$58,053 or some \$6,000 less than the deficit for the previous year. That it was possible to carry on this vastly increased service with such a truly moderate deficit, is a tribute to the efficiency of the Administration. Frequently too great emphasis is given to the quantity of a hospital's service and insufficient stress is laid upon its quality. The quantity of service rendered by an institution is an accurate index of its need-the quality of its service however, is the determining factor in its right to existence. The humane, scientific and efficient treatment of all who have come to our doors is attested to by the hundreds of letters from grateful patients we receive each year. Proud as you are in the knowledge that your Hospital has been a haven for so many sick and suffering, I know that you will take even greater pride in the fact that all patients received treatment of a standard and quality which creates new friends for our Hospital and greater prestige for our Community.

The modern hospital is a highly complex organization. Its smooth functioning depends upon the proper co-ordination of many specialized departments, with the ultimate goal of all, the alleviation of suffering and the restoration to health. The limits which a report of this nature imposes makes it impossible for me to even touch upon the work of each department, all of which contributed substantially towards the accomplishment of our aims. I feel however, that there are several of which special mention should be made.

For our high scientific standards and the calibre of our professional work, great credit is due to the guidance of the Medical Board and to the active coperation of the Medical Staff. A number of changes took place on the Medical Board during the year. Because of pressure of other duties, Dr. A. T. Bazin, for two years Chairman of the Medical Board resigned from this post and was succeeded by Dr. F. G. Finley, Chief of the Department of Medicine. To Dr. Bazin we are indebted for the many contributions which he made to the

scientific development of our Hospital and we are proud that we continue to have the benefits of his long and distinguished experience as a member of our Consulting Staff. The post of Director of Laboratories was made vacant when Dr. David P. Seecof resigned this position. Your Board of Administration has appointed Dr. M. A. Simon of Cleveland, Ohio, to the directorship of this important department. Dr. Simon, who takes up his duties July 1st, comes to us with an excellent scientific background and we welcome his addition to our Staff.

In our report for last year mention was made of the promotion of two members of our staff to the position of Chiefs of Service and to membership on Geo. J. Strean, Chief Obstetrician and Gynaecologist who have during the past year further justified the confidence we placed in them. Their tireless efforts, their sincere interest in their work and in the welfare of their patients, together with the able co-operation of their staffs, have combined to achieve splendid results. We are gratified that we have been able to fulfill one of the important functions of a hospital by revealing and developing the capabilities and leadership of these and other members of our Staff. Doctors A. O. Freedman, Alton Goldbloom, Chas. Liebman, J. Rosenbaum and N. Viner—members of the Medical Board from the inception of the Hospital, continue as Chiefs of their respective departments to contribute effectively towards its progress. Dr. F. G. Finley, Chief of the Department of Medicine and Chairman of the Medical Board has by his sincere interest and active participation in the work, done much to further the scientific standards of our Hospital. Our appreciation and thanks are extended to them all.

It is a pleasure once again to pay tribute to the Women's Auxiliary which has rendered such distinguished service throughout the year. Under the inspired leadership of Mrs. Alton Goldbloom, this Organization has developed into an indispensable arm of the Hospital. Their activities are constantly expanding and their enterprise and initiative continues without abatement. During the year, the Auxiliary did not confine its contributions to domestic articles such as linens, etc., but provided scientific apparatus which continues to mark our Hospital as one of the most modern and best equipped in the City. The Life Saving Fund which provided blood transfusions and special nursing care for the poor, the Children's Nursery Fund which looks after the underprivileged new born infants and the many other activities covered more fully in the report of the President of the Auxiliary which will be published in our Annual Report, is indicative of the broad field which their efforts embrace. Although the great good accomplished by the Auxiliary is its own compensation, we are happy to have this opportunity of expressing our grateful appreciation to the President, Mrs. Alton Goldbloom, to the Executive and Board Members, to the Chairmen of Committees and their members and to the membership at large for their splendid co-operation and their many contributions to the comfort of our patients.

Earlier in this report reference was made to the operating deficit for the year of \$58,053.51. It is this amount, the difference between the income from patients and the government and the expenditures which necessitates our annual appeal for maintenance. Our experience in the past several years has been somewhat disappointing because of failure to reach our full objective. Whilst we are heartened by the fact that our Community has each year responded in increasing numbers to our appeal—and at this juncture I take the opportunity to record our grateful thanks to all those who by their gifts and contributions made possible the work of the Hospital—it is my duty to point out that we can not long continue to accumulate deficits if we are to discharge our responsibilities to the sick poor and if we are to maintain the prestige which has come to us through the humane, efficient and businesslike administration of our Hospital. I am confident that as our people become more intimately acquainted with the great work of the Hospital and the important position which it occupies and when they realize how vital it is to the very life of our Community, they will accord to it the full measure of support which it requires and deserves.

I desire to take this opportunity of recording the grateful appreciation of the Board of Administration to the loyal band of workers who each year so unselfishly devote themselves to the necessary task of raising funds. To the Campaign Executive, Control Chairmen, Zone Chairmen, Publicity and Speakers Committees and to the host of workers who constitute this army, we owe a debt of genuine gratitude. To Mr. E. G. F. Vaz, who as Campaign Director, is the guiding and driving force of the entire Organization, we are again grateful for the benefits of his superlative talents and capabilities. We wish to record our thanks and appreciation to the Federation of Jewish Philanthropies, and to the Montefiore Club for making available their facilities to us during our Campaigns.

The history of hospitals which have achieved true distinction in the field of medical science clearly shows that funds other than those necessary for routine operation have played an important part in their destinies. The progress and growth of a hospital are dependent upon the availability of sufficient funds to enable it to keep abreast of developments in the field of medicine and hospitalization. Such resources can only be assured through the establishment of endowments by the citizens of our Community. Perhaps the greatest achievement of commerce and industry during the past generation has been and is continuing to be the increasing recognition leaders in these fields give to the social problems of the day as they affect mankind. In an intelligent way, they consider the significant social influence on business, and they recognize the reality that when the social structure of any people is at a low ebb, business correspondingly suffers. More and more of our leaders are beginning to recognize that the support of our philanthropies and their efforts to improve the plight of our underprivileged serves a double purpose—that of comfort and happiness to the less fortunate and at the same time a stimulus to better understanding—so essential in these troubled times. The Hospital offers to those who have been blessed with wordly goods a splendid opportunity to accomplish both.

We acknowledge gratefully the following bequests which have been received during the year:

These amounts, together with those previously recorded, constitute the nucleus of our Endowment Fund. Practically all of the bequests have come from people in modest circumstances and are therefore doubly appreciated. It is hoped that the importance of a substantial Endowment Fund to the growth and progress of our Hospital will be given due recognition by those in a position to stimulate and encourage its scientific development.

I am pleased to report that our appeal to those who still owe amounts to the Building Fund, has met with a measure of success during the year. Once more we urge the earliest possible liquidation of outstanding obligations.

We desire to express our thanks and appreciation to Mr. Samuel Bronfman for his gift of a most attractive "Annual Contributors' Tablet" which has been erected in the Hospital Foyer and serves to stimulate the interest of contributors.

The written or spoken word can not possibly convey what a half hour spent in observing the work of the Hospital can accomplish and I should like to urge all Governors to exercise their privilege of visiting the Hospital when invited to do so. To know the Hospital intimately is to understand its many problems and as Governors of the Hospital you should take advantage of every opportunity to learn more about it.

It grieves us to record some of the sorrowful events of the past year. The death of Mr. Lyon Cohen member of our Board of Trustees and for many years

closely identified with every worthwhile philanthropy, is a loss to our Community and Hospital. The death of Mr. A. Z. Cohen, Governor of the Hospital, represents a loss to all our Institutions.

My deep appreciation is due to all members of the Board of Administration and Board of Trustees for their active co-operation throughout the year.

I am glad of this opportunity to pay a well deserved tribute to Mr. S. S. Cohen, who as Superintendent of the Hospital has the difficult task of co-ordinating its many departments. His sound judgment and rare ability coupled with unstinted devotion founded on the deep and genuine interest he takes in every phase of the Hospital, have been important factors in its gratifying progress and development.

To the many department heads and their staffs I extend the thanks of the Board of Administration for their efficient and humane services.

We again gratefully acknowledge the generous support from the Province of Quebec and the City of Montreal. Their continued co-operation makes possible the large charitable service which we are able to afford to so many sick poor in our Community.

Our thanks are due to Messrs. Weinfield & Rudenko and to Mr. Chas. Gavsie for their advice and assistance in matters legal; to Mr. H. E. Herschorn for notarial services and to Mendelsohn Bros. for their services as customs brokers without fee.

We are deeply indebted to the English and Jewish press for their generous and sympathetic support throughout the year.

This report touches only a few highlights of the Hospital's numerous and complex activities. I recommend for your careful perusal the report of the Superintendent which contains most interesting information and statistics in greater detail.

In concluding, may I leave with you the thought that we are all engaged in a great and sacred work. Disease strikes with appalling swiftness where and when we least expect it. Ours is the privilege to share in the great battle which is being waged so valiantly in all civilized parts of the world against the ravages of illness and disease with the determination that they shall not win but that the forces of modern science shall prevail for the benefit of mankind. Greater privilege than the opportunity to participate in this noble work can come to no man.

Your Balance Sheet shows an item of \$2,301.25 representing Bills Receivable on pledges to the Building Fund, as well as \$1,473.51 for pledges receivable on the 1937 Maintenance Fund Campaign. The majority of the payments on these two accounts are being paid at maturity. The item of \$11,280.97, however, made up of past due notes and cheques covering pledges on the Building Fund referred to in our report of last year shows only minor reductions during the year and appears to be of doubtful value.

In addition to liabilities as shown on your Balance Sheet, there is a deferred liability of \$22,179.85 for expropriation taxes to the City of Montreal. This

amount is payable, plus interest, in fifteen annual instalments.

Your statement of Income and Expense on Hospital Operations for the year 1937 shows a net operating loss of \$58,053.51.

Net non-operating Income for the year 1937, represented by contributions to 1937 Maintenance Fund, investment income, donations, memberships, etc., amounted to \$47,900.63.

Net Receipts from pledges to the Building Fund during the year 1937

amounted to \$9,516.11.

Subject to the foregoing, we certify that the attached statements correctly set forth the position of the Jewish General Hospital as on December 31st, 1937 and the operations for the year ended December 31st, 1937 according to the best of our information and the explanations given us and as shown by your books and records.

We must express our appreciation to your Superintendent Mr. S. S. Cohen, to Mr. M. Segal and to Mr. Frederick M. Goldstein and the rest of your office staff for the assistance and co-operation rendered to us during the course of

our audit.

# REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT

MR. ALLAN BRONFMAN, PRESIDENT, JEWISH GENERAL HOSPITAL.

Sir:-

HAVE the honour to submit for your approval the Fourth Annual Report of the Superintendent for the year ended December 31st, 1937.

The Hospital continued to operate during the past year at near capacity. Admissions totaled 4,359, an increase of 532 over the previous year. These patients received a total of 55,095 days of treatment, representing an increase of 7,747 days over 1936. Of the total number of hospital days, 37,397 days were given to public patients, 13,050 days to semi private patients and 4,648 days to private patients. This represents an increase in every classification. The public wards were again taxed beyond their normal capacities. Throughout the year a daily average of more than 100 public patients was maintained. This however failed to meet the demands for public beds and a large waiting list was the inevitable result. Unless additional facilities for public patients are created, we must consider that our peak in the treatment of public patients has been reached. Indigent patients hospitalized under the Quebec Public Charities' Act again accounted for our greatest service. More than half of the Hospital's work is devoted to this group of patients. The private and semi private divisions also showed a gratifying increase in occupancy and were often filled to capacity.

The average stay in the Hospital for all classes of patients was 12.6 days, or approximately the same as last year.

Deaths totaled 129 of which 35 occurred within 48 hours of admission resulting in a net death rate of 2.1%.

There were 670 infants born in the Hospital during the year bringing the number of births since the opening to a total of more than 2,000. The infant mortality during the year was 2%—a decrease of .5% over last year. Whilst recording the statistics of the Obstetrical Department, it is of interest to record the rather unusual experience of the birth of two sets of triplets in our Hospital during the past year. The normal average occurrence of triple births is approximately one set in 9,000 births. If the law of averages continues in force, it is likely to be a long time before such an experience will be repeated. It is significant that in both instances, the presence of triplets was known several months before delivery and as the result of adequate preparation, all the children are alive and thriving today.

The Out-Patient Department continues to attract large numbers of patients who seek treatment in the various clinics. A total of 28,665 visits were made during the year, an increase of almost 4,000 visits over 1936. This growth in service, places a severe tax on the facilities of the Department, as frequently the same room must serve several clinics in rapid succession. As during the previous year, more than half of those attending clinics were unable to pay any fee whatever for treatment given. This department serving a most important section of the Community is responsible for a large part of our deficit.

The statement of Revenue of Expenditures reveals an operating income of \$200,598.04, an increase of \$32,555.58 over the income for 1936. The expenditures were \$258,651.55, an increase of \$27,717.46 over the previous year. The operating deficit was \$58,053.51, a decrease of \$6,162.94 from that of 1936. The increase in income is accounted for by the larger number of patients treated, while the expenditures were higher chiefly for the same reason. The per capita cost for all classes of patients based upon charging the full cost of hospital operations to in-patients was reduced to \$4.69 per day from \$4.87 for the previous year.

Efficiency and economy continue to be our watchwords and we are pleased to be able to report this reduction in the face of increased operating expenses and higher cost of supplies.

The activities of the Medical Staff quite naturally kept pace with the marked increase of service rendered during the year. The Medical Board under the Chairmanship of Dr. A. T. Bazin until the close of the year under review, gave its close co-operation to the administration and I want to acknowledge with thanks their constant interest in the development of our Hospital.

The Department of Laboratories has since the resignation of Dr. Seecof been under the acting directorship of Dr. Leo Spector. I want to express my thanks to Dr. Spector for his valuable assistance. Dr. M. A. Simon, newly appointed Director of the Department will take up his duties on July 1st. Dr. Simon brings to us a rich scientific experience and I look forward to valuable and effective co-operation between him and the clinical departments.

Although the members of our Staff have been largely occupied with the treatment of so great a number of patients, it is gratifying that many of them have found time to participate in research problems, and several excellent contributions to the medical literature have been made by them. With a fund made available by private sources to Dr. Harry C. Ballon, a room has been equipped and is maintained for special research purposes. Dr. Ballon has already submitted for publication one article based upon the work carried out with these facilities and several other important investigations are in progress.

A number of the members of our Staff received honors which it is a pleasure to record: Dr. Geo. J. Stream, Chief of the Department of Obstetrics and Gynaecology was elected to membership in the Royal College of Obstetricians and Gynaecologists. Dr. A. Goldbloom, Chief of the Department of Pediatrics, was elected to the Presidency of the Canadian Society for the study of diseases of children.

The X-Ray Department was extremely active during the year. The increased number of cases undergoing deep x-ray treatment kept the apparatus constantly in use and we are pleased that this most modern weapon in the treatment of cancer and other tumors was made available to such large numbers.

To the clinical departments I extend my deepest appreciation for the effective manner in which they carried out the treatment of our patients. Their excellent direction and the co-operation of each member of the Staff contributed to the smooth functioning of the Hospital.

The Nursing Department has again rendered excellent service to the sick and I wish that it were possible to make their burden lighter by providing living quarters for them. A nurses' home is an urgent need which overshadows our many requirements.

The farm project having established its value in previous years, again served to provide an abundance of fresh green vegetables throughout the summer months and a surplus of the ordinary varieties for use during the winter. A new root house with adequate facilities for the storage of the surplus was constructed and further contributed towards the economy of our food budget. Home canning was carried out on a large scale, some 5,000 cans of fruits and vegetables having been prepared during the canning season. These activities together with the exercise of close supervision helped us to maintain our reputation for good food and low cost. The cost per meal for raw foods was 9.8 cents. In a year when essential foods reached considerably higher levels, this may be regarded as a worthy achievement.

We are gratified at the recognition accorded us by the Montreal School of Social Work, an affiliate of McGill University which has designated our Social Service Department as one of its centres for field instruction for its students, a further indication that our high standards are being maintained in all departments.

The physical plant continues to be maintained in excellent condition, thanks to the capable and interested supervision of the House and Purchase Committee under the chairmanship of Mr. David Kirsch. Mr. E. E. Workman has been of inestimable assistance in the planning and carrying out of an efficient maintenance program. Messrs. S. Blumenthal, N. L. Engel and M. Latsky have each rendered invaluable services in their respective fields.

The Women's Auxiliary rendered service during the year which it is impossible to properly evaluate within the limits of this report. The linen supply was constantly ample, despite the rapid turnover of so large a number of patients. Always devoted to the interests of the public patients, the Auxiliary presented us with an electrically heated food truck which makes it possible to serve food at its best to the ward patients. Many other contributions of essential equipment were made. The "Life Saving Fund" was heavily drawn on during the year and many public patients received its benefits. In addition to these tangible gifts, the Auxiliary continues to be the greatest force in our Community for the dissemination of good will towards the Hospital. I want to express my deepest personal appreciation to Mrs. Goldbloom, president of the Auxiliary, to the Officers and Membership for their helpfulness and for their understanding of the Hospital's problems. The manifold activities of the Auxiliary are a tribute to womanhood.

My sincere thanks are again due to the officers and members of the Board of Administration and to the various committees. Their considerate and thoughtful interest in the welfare of the Hospital has been an important factor in the proper administration of it.

We have been fortunate indeed to have been able to attract a staff which is so loyal and devoted to the Hospital's cause. Time permits only the mention of the Department Heads who by their sincerity have inspired such splendidly efficient and humane services by their staffs. To Miss Mendels, Miss Goldman, Miss Berry, Mrs. Magruder, Mr. Segal, Mr. Bagan, Mr. Carmichael, Mr. Hanau, Mr. Kestman and to the members of their staffs, I am deeply grateful for their close co-operation.

My grateful appreciation is extended to the many friends of the Hospital who have continued to manifest their interest in it by their generous contributions.

In the administration of the Hospital we have been always mindful of the great responsibility which rests upon us—responsibility not only to those who have been entrusted to our care but to our entire community whose prestige rises or falls with the achievements or failures of our Institutions. The record of the Hospital's work which has been placed before you, is I feel one which reflects credit on all those who were identified with it.

In concluding this report may I again express to you, Mr. President, my own gratitude for the great personal interest you have taken in all of the Hospital's problems and for the intelligent advice you have always given me. Working with you has been a genuine pleasure from which I derived true inspiration.

## WOMEN'S AUXILIARY

#### REPORT OF THE PRESIDENT

READ AT THE ANNUAL MEETING OF THE AUXILIARY, JANUARY 5, 1938.

THE completion of a second year of service to the Jewish General Hospital by the Women's Auxiliary brings with it the pleasurable task of your President of briefly reviewing the highlights of our contributions, and at the same time of making acknowledgment to those who have served so faithfully and helped to build so magnificent a record.

Our Life-Saving Fund, supported by a group of Patronesses, as well as by voluntary contributions throughout the year, has been a boon to those desperately sick poor patients who have required blood transfusions, special nursing, and special drugs. We were able to meet all requisitions to the amount of \$2,197.89, and I may add that it served, as always, every patient irrespective of race or creed. This fund made possible the gift to the Hospital of an Oxygen Tent at a cost of \$255. and five dollars weekly to purchase insulin for the needy diabetic patients. I wish that it were possible for me to pay individual tribute to each Patroness of the Life-Saving Fund, as well as to each contributor. I can only tell you that year by year, as you renew your interest in this fund, your names will continue to be inscribed in our beautiful volume as permanent testimony to your understanding hearts. We are grateful to Mrs. Allan Bronfman

for maintaining this tribute volume. This book will be on display at all meetings, and I would urge those who find it possible to affiliate themselves with this branch of our work to do so as soon as possible. For the many donations that have been received to this fund we are very grateful, and do extend our warm thanks. Sir James Barrie has reminded us that

"Those who bring sunshine into the lives of others cannot keep it from themselves."

Another monument to our energy and endeavor, is the gift to the Hospital of an electric food conveyor for public patients at a cost of \$675. This enables food to be carried and served hot and hence more palatable. I have requested that a small engraved plate, denoting that the gift was presented by the Women's Auxiliary, be placed on this and all other equipment given to the hospital by us. I earnestly hope we may find it possible to meet many such needs. It is with pride and pleasure that we have set aside \$1,600. to supply photographic equipment, and \$500. for the much needed enlargement of the nursery. I would here pause to stress the pleasure we feel in being able to appreciate and support the needs of the scientific development of the hospital, as well as the more practical requirements. We were gratified at being able to supply forty-five more over-bed tables at a cost of \$500. thus assuring every adult patient in the hospital of this additional comfort. We also gave one hundred wire clothes hangers for public patients, at an expense of \$80. \$1,711.87 was spent on equipment throughout the year. Linens requisitioned in 1937 remain our largest contribution and responsibility to the hospital, to the amount of \$4,003.69. Through the interest of the Women's Auxiliary, the Deep X-Ray Therapy Room was furnished by Mrs. A. C. Benjamin, our own chairman of the telephone committee and a devoted member of our Board. A sewing table and motor, also a gynaecological instrument, were made available by the remaining funds of the Ladies' Auxiliary of the Old Hebrew Maternity Hospital. To Mrs. Benjamin and the Ladies' Auxiliary we would express grateful thanks for their kindness.

It might be well if at this time I reviewed our meetings and interesting events as they occurred during 1937. Our First Annual Meeting last January followed soon after the ascent to the throne of our present King. As a large group of his most loyal subjects of the Jewish faith, we pledged our allegiance to him. The formation of a clerical committee to handle our notices under the chairmanship of one of our patronesses—Mrs. H. Levine—was announced. She and her committee have given us a faithful service for which we are grateful. An address by our genial Superintendent of the hospital, Mr. S. S. Cohen, on "Hospitals as Guardians of Health", proved extremely informative and interesting. A musical program by Miss Fanny Kirschenbaum and Master Leo Breitman added to the pleasure of the meeting.

At our February Board meeting two new committees were introduced for the benefit of the hospital. The collection of bottles and jars was begun at this time under the chairmanship of Mrs. T. Percy Hirsch and Mrs. Jacob Stewart, aided by a well organized committee. We appealed to all members, clubs and drug stores to save their jars and bottles. The excellent report which Mrs. Hirsch presented of the collection of 46,940 bottles and jars which realized \$406.64 is a tribute to herself, her co-chairman, and their workers. Thanks are due also to those who co-operated with us in collecting these bottles and jars. Without the co-operation of Mr. Brown of the Brown Bottle Exchange, our success in this field of endeavor would have been more limited. We assure him of our gratitude for his assistance in helping us to serve the hospital. The monies raised by the sale of these bottles and jars is enabling us to purchase all the dispensary bottles required for public patients. I would urge you to continue to save your bottles and jars, and to notify one of the chairmen when you have fifty or preferably more. A gift of 60,000 new bottles was made to the hospital through the efforts of Mrs. Victor Cape, and we extend to her and the donor a vote of thanks.

Another branch of activity begun at the same time, was the creation of the Children's Nursery Fund under the guidance of Mrs. J. Rubin assisted by Mrs. J. Lifshitz which has shown gratifying results and excellent promise for the future. The work of this committee has necessitated a vast amount of clerical and follow-up work. To Mrs. J. Rubin, Mrs. J. Lifshitz, and those who assisted them, we owe a hearty measure of thanks. Please realize that the funds raised in this way will be used entirely for the benefit of the Nursery. You can help by enrolling your children as members of the Children's Nursery Fund.

The March meeting was distinguished by our speaker, Mrs. Gershon Levi, who spoke fascinatingly on "Jewish Art", and by a string quartet under the leadership of Mr. Richard Cantor. It is fitting that I should at this moment pay tribute to our chairman of music, Mrs. Ezra Lozinski, who has throughout the year provided entertainment of a high order in spite of the difficulty of securing talent gratis. She has earned our gratitude and sincere thanks.

At our May meeting we presented Mr. L. S. B. Shapiro, well-known New York columnist of the Gazette, who spoke on "Observations on the American Scene." It was gratifying to greet him with a very large audience. We were greatly honoured to have him, and are appreciative of the graciousness with which he accepted our invitation.

The final draft of our Charter and By-Laws, prepared some months earlier by our vice-president, Mrs. C. J. Gross, and Mr. Isidore Ballon, K.C., was approved at a Board meeting in April, and sent for Government sanction. With a few minor changes, further approved by your Board, it became law during the summer. Mrs. Gross became Mrs. Charles Kauvar early in the year; we are grateful to Mrs. Kauvar and to Mr. Ballon who gave his service gratis for enabling us to have this legal guidance.

An event which will long be remembered, our Garden Fête, comes to mind next. Our host and hostess, Mr. and Mrs. Allan Bronfman, provided us with a fairyland, a feast for the eye as well as for the inner man. Thanks to their ever present generosity, we have to our credit the net proceeds of \$2,479.00 from that Fête. The ticket convenors, Mrs. Rose Lavene, Mrs. J. H. Marx, Mrs. S. Pesner, Mrs. H. Sabloff, Mrs. J. Schulman, and Mrs. Jack Wener, and all those who assisted them, worked faithfully and loyally to make this grand success possible, and to all who contributed so splendidly I would extend our appreciation and thanks.

In the early autumn, the necessity of providing layettes for the occasional needy baby born in the hospital was brought to my attention. Mrs. Jack Klein graciously accepted the chairmanship of this new service and to her we extend our best thanks and assurance of our high regard.

The last general meeting of 1937 took place on November third, when Miss C. I. Mackenzie, B.A., Principal of the Montreal High School for Girls, spoke on "Women's Opportunity in the Present Educational Situation," to a large and attentive audience. Her knowledge and sincerity made a distinct impression and appeal. Thus closed our general meetings in 1937, each one leaving behind it a pleasurable sense of worthwhileness.

Numerous Executive meetings were held throughout the year to study the problems that faced us. We found a welcome home for these meetings at the offices of Distillers Corporation, to whom we are greatly indebted for their hospitality, and I would ask them to accept this expression of our appreciation. We are also indebted to the Montefiore Club for allowing us the use of their rooms on a number of occasions.

A charming tea for convenors and workers at the home of Mrs. Allan Bronfman preceded the final grand event of our 1937 season. It was our First Annual Ball, which took place at the Windsor Hotel on the evening of December eleventh. The co-chairmen of tickets, Mrs. Rose Medine and Mrs. L. Deitcher, together with a large group of ladies and gentlemen who assisted them, deserve our most grateful thanks, for we look back upon a Ball that reflects glory upon those who made such a social and financial success possible. I wish time permitted me to mention each individual who helped to bring this event to its magnificent culmination. I would assure Mrs. Medine and Mrs. Deitcher and all who assisted them of our deep appreciation. It is fitting that I should extend to Mrs. Medine an added expression of our high regard for opening her home to the business of the Ball, and for being on duty night and day. The handsome amount which we realized of \$2,288.27 speaks for itself.

Chanukah has come and gone, and the sick children were again well remembered by the Women's Auxiliary with gifts. \$43.74 was spent for toys throughout the year, and our devoted friend Mrs. Samuel Bronfman again remembered the children with beautiful presents. We are indebted to Mrs. S. J. Usher and Mrs. Norman Viner for purchasing the gifts for the children.

The Board has served faithfully and well in our undertakings throughout the year, and they deserve the expression of our high regard. And I would remind them that we must ever look to them to carry on if we are to maintain our high standard of service.

The surgical dressing groups under the chairmanship of Mrs. Geo. Strean, Mrs. Samuel Klein, Mrs. S. Pesner, Mrs. L. Miller, Mrs. Norman Viner and Mrs. Saul Usher, together with large groups of ladies, are rendering excellent service in their department and during 1937 made 234,369 dressings. They deserve our hearty thanks. Mrs. H. Shiller has carried a considerable burden as chairman of the car committee, in providing cars to take poor patients requiring treatment to and from the hospital. I would assure Mrs. Shiller that her devotion to duty is highly regarded. Mrs. A. C. Benjamin, as chairman of the telephone committee, has always served when called upon. Mrs. Jos. Greenberg and Mrs. Albert Wener have been constantly at work caring for the linen purchasing and sewing groups, and thus have kept the linen expense at a minimum. They have been devoted to their responsibilities, and I would ask them to accept the assurance of our high regard, and to convey our sincere appreciation to the ladies assisting them.

As chairman of membership, Mrs. M. J. Raff has been an inspiration for loyalty and dependability, and a source of comfort to me personally. Hers is a tremendous task, carried out efficiently and to a highly gratifying conclusion of two thousand paid members for 1937. Mrs. Raff has the personal satisfaction of having served well, and we would ask her to accept and convey to the faithful who assisted her our grateful thanks.

Mrs. A. Raginsky Sr. looked after our publicity efficiently and well in keeping our work before the public. She has at all times been extremely helpful. I would here extend to the Star, the Gazette, The Canadian Jewish Chroniele, the Canadian Jewish Review, and the Jewish Eagle our appreciation for the space they have given us.

Mrs. H. Singer has most ably looked after our meetings, and Mrs. Allan Bronfman is ever responsive to the call to duty. Mrs. S. Leopold and Mrs. Jos. Kruger have been co-operative and helpful when called upon. We regret that frequent absence from the city has brought the resignation of Mrs. Kruger as one of our vice-presidents, but it is with sincere pleasure that I note that she has joined our distinguished group of Patronesses, and thus continues her interest in our work.

The financial department, in the capable hands of Mrs. Samuel Bronfman as treasurer and Mrs. Victor Michaels as Financial Secretary, has rendered a very satisfying account of their labours. Mrs. Bronfman has had the assistance of Mrs. Mendel Segal, to whom we are very grateful. Mrs. Michaels responsibility has been of considerable proportion and she has served it loyally, while

Mrs. Samuel Bronfman has given assistance in every department when called upon. We would assure them both of our high regard and appreciation. I wish to thank Mrs. Geo. Strean for her devoted service during Mrs. Michaels illness.

To our honorary Auditor Mr. I. Blackman we would extend the profound appreciation of the Women's Auxiliary, and I would assure him of our gratitude for his generous service.

Our Recording Secretary, Mrs. M. Greenblatt, has served us faithfully. We regret her resignation owing to long periods of absence from the city. As a member of our Board I feel sure she will continue to serve the hospital whenever possible.

And last but by no means least, our two devoted and faithful secretaries, Mrs. David Tannenbaum and Mrs. L. K. Freedman, long may they reign. Ever on the job, they have been a great comfort to their president. Just a simple but genuine 'thank you' is extended to them.

My closing remarks concern those whom I may have forgotten, but not intentionally. I thank you all in the name of those less fortunate who benefit by your devotion to the cause.

To the president of the hospital, Mr. Allan Bronfman, and to the superintendent, Mr. S. S. Cohen, I would express my appreciation for their everready co-operation and helpfulness.

Section 30 - Exemption for Religious Purposes, Etc.

"No duty shall be leviable on property devised or bequeathed for religious, charitable or educational purposes to be carried out in the Province of Quebec by a corporation or a society having an establishment within the Province of Quebec, or by a person resident in the Province of Quebec, nor on the amount of any unpaid subscription for any like purpose made by any person in his lifetime to any corporation, society or person mentioned in this section."
