

*REPORT OF THE PRESIDENT

TO THE GOVERNORS OF THE JEWISH GENERAL HOSPITAL:-

ON behalf of your Board of Administration, I have the honor to submit for your approval the Sixth Annual Report of the Hospital for the year ended December 31st, 1939.

During the past year, the Hospital continued to operate at practical capacity, recording a total of 60,953 patient days,—an increase of 478 days over

the previous year.

The Public Wards were once again under severe pressure and although operating throughout the year beyond their normal capacities, were unable to accommodate all who sought admission. The continued crowding of the Public Wards and the inability to serve hundreds of patients seeking admission, is a problem which must be met as soon as it becomes possible to do so, if we are to continue to serve the needs of the Community and maintain our high standards of Hospital care. This is a matter which deserves, and has received, the serious consideration of your Board of Administration and I shall return to it later in the report.

Meanwhile, let me refer briefly to our financial position. Annual deficits in the operation of a modern Hospital are recognized and expected. The time has passed when we need apologize for losses incurred through the treatment of those whose very lives are threatened and who are able to pay little or nothing for service. Once this is understood, and when we are convinced—as we are—that every conceivable economy is practiced by our Hospital, we will consider no longer the Hospital deficit as evidence of inefficiency, but rather as the symbol of a broad service to humanity.

The deficit recorded for the year 1939 was \$64,517.14, or greater in amount by \$10,395.20 than in the previous year. The increased deficit is due largely to a general increase in operating costs, including the higher cost of food, medical, surgical and other supplies.

Non-Operating income, which includes net proceeds from our 1939 Maintenance Campaign, and other sundry income—totalled \$49,434.69 which, if deducted from the operating loss, leaves a net deficit of \$15,082.45 for the year. When this sum is added to our accumulated deficits of previous years, it ac-

counts for our Bank debt of \$100,000.00.

This burden of debt gave your Board of Administration serious concern during the year under review and caused us to make a comprehensive survey of our entire financial position; at the same time giving consideration to the problems of expanding our facilities to meet the growing demand for our services. The study revealed that we were in urgent need of the following additions:—

Increased Laboratory space, at an estimated cost of \$50,000.00.
 Fifty additional Ward Beds, at an estimated cost of \$75,000.00.

3. A Nurses' Home, at an estimated cost of \$150,000.00.

The need for each of these projects has been referred to in previous reports and careful study by your Board leaves no room for doubt as to their urgency.

The Bank's refusal to extend our overdraft, and its insistence that steps be taken to reduce it, brought to us the realization that we were facing a crisis. A review of our Budget for the year 1940 showed that increased cost of fuel, food, medical and other supplies, would result in an operating deficit of \$75,000. Our inability to secure an extension of credit made it imperative that we raise the full amount of this deficit in our forthcoming Campaign. We were, therefore, confronted with three problems, each of vital importance.

1. The problem of expansion to meet increased demands on our services.

The problem of devising ways and means to wipe out our debt resulting from accumulated deficits.

 The problem of balancing our Budget in order not to incur further indebtedness.
 *Presented at the Sixth Annual Meeting, June 3rd, 1940. After long and careful deliberation, during which many leaders of our Community were consulted, your Board of Administration decided that despite the importance of the need for increased facilities, the time was not opportune for seeking funds for expansion. It was further decided that although the Bank's overdraft constituted a serious threat to the financial stability of the Hospital, any attempt to reduce or eliminate it would have to wait until after we were assured of being able to secure on an annual basis the full amount required to meet current operating deficits. All agreed that our first duty was to balance our Budget by raising the \$75,000.00 necessary to offset the anticipated deficit which would result from the operations for the year 1940. The enormous task of raising \$25,000.00 more than we ever secured in any Maintenance Campaign, was not underestimated by us, and we determined to bring the full story of the Hospital's critical situation to the attention of our Community. Accordingly, one of the most intensive Campaigns in the history of our Community was conducted, and the gratifying response which met our urgent appeal, is tangible evidence of the deeply rooted place which the Hospital occupies in the hearts of our people. It is vital that the standards established in this Campaign shall be maintained in future years, so that we may carry on, unimpaired, the great humanitarian work which continues to add lustre and prestige to our name.

At this point let me pause to pay tribute to those who participated in our Campaign Organization. Aroused by the danger which threatened the very existence of our Hospital, leaders and workers alike, responded as one man and carried on their work with relentless intensity until victory was ours. The splendid performance of every member of the Organization makes it impossible to select any individuals for special mention, for all played equally important roles and success was due to co-operative zeal and intensive effort. To attempt to thank them would detract from the high service which they rendered. Their reward is the everlasting gratitude of Nature's most pitiful creature—the sick poor—who look to us for relief from suffering and restoration to health.

I cannot, however, refrain from expressing a word of special gratitude to the Federation of Jewish Philanthropies for having year after year made available to us their excellent staff and facilities during our Campaigns. To Mr. E. G. F. Vaz who, through long and intimate association with the work of the Hospital, has been an important factor in the conduct of all our Campaigns, we are deeply grateful for his splendid performance this year as Chairman of the Publicity Committee. The forceful manner in which his Committee brought the Hospital's message to the Community was in no small measure responsible for the success of the Campaign. We were very fortunate to have had the valuable services of Mr. George Erlick, of Federation's Staff, as Campaign Secretary. Mr. Erlick's intelligent and efficient management of the many phases of the Campaign, contributed materially to the result achieved. We are glad of the opportunity to pay him this well deserved tribute.

Whilst we are highly gratified to have reached our objective in this Campaign and are greatly relieved to know that our Operating Budget for the current year is assured, we must not overlook the fact that our financial position remains virtually unchanged, for we are still faced with the burden of debt to the Bank, amounting to \$100,000.00. As businessmen, you will readily see that the burden of such indebtedness, with its resulting interest charges, tends to undermine the stability of our financial structure and is the cause of much concern to your Board. We sincerely hope that at the first sign of improvement in general conditions, some means will be found to relieve us of the worry of debt, so that we may devote all our thought and energy to serving the sick and the further development of our Hospital.

During the year the Board of Administration suffered the loss of one of its esteemed and respected members. The death of Jackson H. Marx has deprived the Community of one of its most stimulating and genuinely sympathetic personalities. Although a member of the Board for only a short period, Mr. Marx had long taken a deep interest in the work and progress of the Hospital. His death was a distinct loss to our Community and a keen personal loss to those

of us who were associated with him. The vacancy thus created has been filled in accordance with the By-Laws, by the appointment of Mr. Sydney Levitt. Mr. Levitt brings to the Board of Administration a long record of Community responsibility and service and we are gratified to have him thus more closely associated with the work of the Hospital.

A distinct honor has been conferred on your Hospital during the year by McGill University, when it selected ours as one of five Hospitals in the City of Montreal where its graduates are to obtain the year of internship required under their revised Medical Course. We are particularly proud, after only five years of operation, to have received this endorsement of our scientific standards, from one of America's great Universities. Such recognition will stimulate us to strive for even greater accomplishment in the field of scientific medicine and hospitalization.

Teaching is an important part of the function of every good Hospital. During the year we co-operated with the Mt. Sinai Sanatorium in the conduct of its Summer School in Tuberculosis. All our facilities were made available and sessions were held in the Hospital which were presided over by some of the most outstanding international authorities in the field of Tuberculosis. A large number of practicing physicians from all parts of the United States and Canada attended the course and we are very happy to have been able to participate in this effort to bring to them the latest developments in the diagnosis and treatment of a disease which is engaging the attention of health authorities everywhere and is presently receiving special emphasis in our Province.

We are gratified to record that several members of our staff have been honored during the year. Dr. Alton Goldbloom was made Assistant Professor of Pediatrics at McGill University. Dr. George J. Strean was elected to Fellowship in the American College of Surgeons, while Dr. Baruch Silverman was elected to Fellowship in the American Psychiatric Association.

The Medical Staff under the guidance of our Medical Board, continues to make progress in the scientific development of our Hospital. We are indebted to Dr. F. G. Finley, Chairman, and to all the members of the Staff for their co-operation in maintaining the high standards of the Hospital.

In previous reports, we have emphasized the need for developing our Endowment Fund. Whether it be for the Endowment of one of our specific needs such as a Laboratory, an additional wing for Ward Beds, a Nurses' Home, or a single bed,—no greater oppportunity is available for perpetuating the name of a loved one. We urge all who can, to give serious consideration to this means of bringing to our Hospital the financial security which only a substantial Endowment Fund can assure.

There are in our Community today some who did not participate in the original Building Fund or who gave amounts which they are now in a position to increase. The Tablet listing Contributors of \$500.00 and over, which adorns our entrance foyer, is undergoing revision and we urge all who can to have their names engraved on the new Tablet, thereby ensuring permanent and lasting evidence of their interest and public spirited generosity. It is important to note that monies received from this source constitute part of our Endowment Fund and we are gratified to report that during our recent Campaign, a number of our subscribers recognized the importance of strengthening our financial structure by making contributions to the Endowment Fund in addition to their annual subscription.

No report of the Hospital's activities would be complete without mention of the important part which the Women's Auxiliary continues to play in its

progress. I refer you to the Report of its President—Mrs. Alton Goldbloom, for a full and detailed record of its activities and contributions. It is an inspiring document which is a tribute to the sacrifice and devotion of its officers and members. We are grateful to the Auxiliary for their many tangible gifts and for their loyal and devoted efforts in the interests of the Hospital. The Auxiliary's dynamic President—Mrs. Alton Goldbloom, was honored during the year when she was invited by the American Hospital Association to read a paper before its convention held in Toronto. The paper was subsequently published in "Hospitals", the official journal of the American Hospital Association, and evoked considerable comment from organizations throughout the United States and Canada.

To my fellow members of the Board of Administration; to the Chairmen and members of the various Committees; and to the members of the Board of Trustees, I am indebted for their close co-operation.

On behalf of the Board of Administration, I wish to express our grateful thanks to the Province of Quebec and the City of Montreal for their kind assistance; to Messrs. Weinfield & Rudenko, and to Mr. Charles Gavsie for legal advice; to Mr. H. E. Herschorn for notarial services; and to Messrs. Mendelssohn Bros. for their services as Customs Brokers. Our grateful appreciation is due the Montefiore Club for having made its facilities available to us during our Campaign.

The Press has once again rendered us valuable support and we are grateful for this co-operation.

To Mr. S. S. Cohen, Superintendent, and to the members of his staff, we extend our appreciation for their loyal services. I am happy to record the honor which was bestowed on Mr. Cohen during the year when he was elected to membership in the American College of Hospital Administrators. His keen interest in the work of our Hospital and in hospitalization generally, has merited this distinction.

During the course of a year the Hospital is the recipient of many and varied contributions, and although it is impossible to detail them all, we acknowledge their receipt with gratitude. To our Governors and Contributors we are grateful for their generous support which ensures the continuation of the Hospital's services to all regardless of race or creed. The Jewish General Hospital is a monument to the Jewish Community's pride of citizenship and sense of responsibility. The hands that built it are blessed. Even more blessed are the hands that maintain it, for without them it cannot continue its great humanitarian work. It is they who make its gentle mercies everlasting.

In conclusion I think we may look back with justifiable pride on our accomplishments of the past year. Although handicapped by disturbed world conditions, the volume and high standard of our service were fully maintained. We are living in a sick and unhappy time. The dark shadows of war have once again fallen upon us. In this struggle we are determined that cruelty, terror and intolerance must be destroyed. To this end we have dedicated our energies and resources and pray for speedy victory. Be the struggle long or short, however, the work of our Hospital and others like it, MUST go on. We cannot permit them to fail because of the illness of the world, for they constitute the expression of man's eternal responsibility and love for his fellowman, and in times such as these, must be maintained as an indication of the triumph of man's spirit. What lies ahead is difficult to foretell. With the rest of the world we now stand at the crossroads; determined, that in whichever direction we may be called upon to walk, we shall do so with calm confidence in the permanence of our democratic Institutions and in their ultimate survival.

We have made an audit of the books and records of the Jewish General Hospital for the year ended December 31st, 1939, and are now pleased to present our report.

Included herewith are the following statements:

RECONCILIATION OF CAPITAL ACCOUNT—as at December 31st, 1939.

We have examined vouchers for all disbursements and have verified all financial transactions. Bank balances have been verified by means of certificates furnished by your Bankers. Cash on Hand, cheques and notes, have been duly verified and checked. Securities have been checked by actual examination and by certificate of the depositaries. Inventories are shown in accordance with figures submitted by your Superintendent.

The item of "Investments—Bonds", shown on your records at a book value of \$28,435.75, is represented by the following:

There are included in your Balance Sheet, items of \$685.35 and \$3,548.05 covering amounts due on current Building Fund pledges and 1939 Maintenance Fund subscriptions. The majority of the payments on these accounts have been and are being made at maturity. The balance of \$11,230.13, however, covering past due notes and cheques for pledges to the Building Fund, which has been carried on your books for the past five years with negligible payment thereon, has been written back to your Surplus account.

In addition to liabilities shown on your Balance Sheet, there exists a deferred liability of \$19,220.07 for expropriation taxes to the City of Montreal. This amount is payable, plus interest in thirteen equal annual instalments.

Your Statement of Income and Expense on Hospital Operations for the year 1939 shows a net operating loss of \$64,517.14.

Net Non-Operating Income for the year 1939, represented by contributions to Maintenance Funds, Investment Income, donations, memberships, etc., amounted to \$49,434.69.

Net Income from pledges to the Building Fund during the year 1939, amounted to \$1,549.96.

Subject to the foregoing, we certify that the attached statements correctly set forth the position of the Jewish General Hospital as on December 31st, 1939 and the results of the operations for the year ended December 31st, 1939 ac-

cording to the best of our information and the explanations and information given us and as shown by your books and records.

We wish to express our deep appreciation to your Superintendent, Mr. S. S. Cohen, to Mr. M. Segal and to Mr. Frederick M. Goldstein, as well as your office staff for the assistance and co-operation rendered to us during the course of our audit.

*REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT

MR. ALLAN BRONFMAN, PRESIDENT, JEWISH GENERAL HOSPITAL.

Sir:-

HAVE the honor to submit for your approval the Sixth Annual Report of the Superintendent for the year ended December 31st, 1939.

The year under review reveals that the Jewish General Hospital once again rendered a large volume of service to the City and Community. A total of 4,401 patients were given 60,953 days of treatment. Although the number of patients treated decreased slightly, the patient days increased by 478 over the total for the previous year. As in previous years, the largest proportion of our services were rendered to patients occupying public ward beds, who, this year, accounted for 39,383 days. Private patients received a total of 5,248 days of treatment, while semi-private patients were given 16,322 days. The private and semi-private services represent an increase of 10% over that of last year.

In previous reports we stressed that our public wards were operating under severe pressure. The past year only served to emphasize this fact. With occupancy maintained at approximately 100% throughout the year, we, nevertheless, continue to have large waiting lists for public beds. This problem is a distressing one and requires our most urgent consideration. Continuous operation at maximum capacity has a tendency to reduce patient comfort and treatment efficiency—an eventuality which we are determined to avoid.

In the private and semi-private divisions, the demand for beds was continuous throughout the year, and not infrequently patients were forced to wait for from one to five days for beds. The need for increased accommodation is becoming serious and it is hoped that as soon as conditions return to a more or less normal state, energetic steps will be taken to increase our facilities.

The daily average census of patients was 167, as compared with 165 for the last year. The maximum number of patients in residence on any one day was 203. The average days' stay in the Hospital was 13.6 days, as compared with 13 days for the previous year.

The Out-Patient Department continues to show extreme activity. A total of 31,316 visits were made during the year by patients attending the various clinics. Here too we have reached a point where additional space is urgently needed. The thorough examination and treatment of patients attending clinics and the more frequent resort to X-Ray and other Laboratory examinations, bring the cost of this service to an amount approximating \$1.00 per visit. When it is realized that the average income per visit was only 12 cents, it becomes immediately apparent to what extent the Out-Patient Department contributes towards the creation of the Hospital deficit. It nevertheless, must be considered that this Department is a distinct asset to the health of the Community, recognizing as it does, disease in its early stages and thereby frequently obviating the necessity for a long hospital stay.

Turning to the matter of finances, we find that the total operating expenditures for the year were \$282,829.64, while the net income from and for patients, totalled \$218,312.50, leaving a gross operating deficit of \$64,517.14. Although the income shows an increase of approximately \$5,000.00 over last year, expenditures rose \$15,000.00 for the year. The increased cost of practically every commodity, including wages, accounts for the higher cost of operation.

The cost per patient day was \$4.64, as compared with \$4.42 for last year; an increase of only 5% over the low figure for the previous year. Considering the marked advance in the cost of a large number of items making up the Hospital Budget, this represents a very satisfactory experience.

Having touched upon phases of the Hospital's work, which permit measurement in terms of figures, I should like to devote the next few minutes to an evaluation of the less tangible aspects of the Hospital's work. In the field of scientific medicine, we continue to make progress with every Department contributing. The Medical Board, under the chairmanship of Dr. Finley, has been constantly on the alert to advance our standards. While this report permits of only brief reference to the work of several Departments, it is hoped that you will obtain from it some indication of the work all perform.

The Department of Medicine has maintained its usual activity, although limited in the number of cases it could treat by lack of beds. While the bed shortage has been referred to as general, this Department feels the deficiency more keenly in that the largest portion of our waiting list is made up of patients suffering from medical ailments. The work of the Department is well organized and every effort is made to obtain the maximum use of the number of beds at our disposal.

The work of the Department of Surgery continues very satisfactorily, both in volume and in results achieved, and here too a large volume of service is

rendered to Public Patients.

The X-Ray Department shows a record of increased activity. The larger number of private patients being referred from outside sources, resulted in revenue which has served to offset in part, the cost of examination of the large number of free cases. The weekly X-Ray Conferences have become an important feature of the professional activities of the Hospital and have attracted a large number of physicians. The Therapy section of the Department has shown a marked increase in its work. This is due to the Department's initiative in the use of X-Ray treatment for a number of conditions in which its use has previously been limited. The results achieved would appear to justify our renewed interest in this form of therapy. The large volume of work and the limited space available have made it difficult for the Department to give to private patients a greater sense of comfort and segregation from public patients to which they are entitled. The Staff has, however, made every effort to treat all patients with courtesy and facility under this handicap.

The Laboratories show an increase in all branches of its work. It is gratifying that greater use has been made of the Department's facilities by private and semi-private patients; resulting in increased income from the Department. The Clinical Pathological Conferences continue to be well attended and serve as the focal point of our educational program. Research work is in progress and the Department co-operates with the Clinical Divisions in a very satisfactory manner. That the Department is severely handicapped through lack of proper accommodation, has been referred to previously. No immediate remedy, other than a building program, seems to be capable of solving this difficulty.

In the Department of Obstetrics & Gynaecology, occupancy was maintained at approximately the same level as last year. There were 756 infants born during the year, an increase of 6 over last year. Reconstruction of the Nurseries was carried out during the year with funds made available through the generosity of our Women's Auxiliary. The changes made include the installation of a complete air conditioning plant, which makes possible absolute control of temperature and humidity throughout the year, while ultra violet light is utilized for air sterilization. These, together with other improvements, enable us to provide unsurpassed accommodation for the new born and introduce the most scientific and advanced facilities for the care of infants. Our experience with the behaviour and comfort of the infants has exceeded the expectations of all concerned.

All Departments and Sub-Departments, devoted themselves to the task of treating the large number of patients and participated in maintaining the high quality of our services. The recognition given us by McGill University, and referred to in the President's Report, is an indication that our constant efforts to develop and maintain high standards for our professional work, have not been in vain.

The record of contributions made by the Women's Auxiliary continues to show the importance of this Organization. Interested in all phases of the Hospital's work, the Auxiliary's ready and sympathetic response to our call for assistance in meeting any problem, has made it so much a part of the Hospital as to be absolutely indispensable to us. It was my privilege to be present at the Convention of the American Hospital Association in Toronto, when Mrs. Goldbloom, President of the Auxiliary, read her paper entitled "Can a Hospital afford to be without an Auxiliary?" The record of the Auxiliary's contributions, as it was presented by Mrs. Goldbloom, left no doubt as to the answer. The enthusiastic reception of the paper and the large number of enquiries Mrs. Goldbloom has had for copies of her paper, indicate that the Women's Auxiliary of the Jewish General Hospital is unique amongst many large and well organized Hospital Auxiliaries. I am indebted to Mrs. Goldbloom, President, and to the Chairmen and members of the various Committees, for their close co-operation throughout the year. Our appreciation is due to the large number of Auxiliary members who render distinct service to the Hospital by making dressings and sewing various articles. Their assistance has resulted in considerable savings.

The Hospital Buildings, Power Plant and equipment were well maintained throughout the year and presented no unusual problems. Additional repairs to certain sections of the brickwork were accomplished during the year and no further difficulty from this source is anticipated. In the carrying out of the maintenance program, the Engineering Staff of the Hospital was given valuable assistance by Messrs. David Kirsch and E. E. Workman of the House and Purchase Committee, with other members of the Committee co-operating.

The Farm was worked to the full capacity of the land available and yielded produce which contributed materially to the maintenance of our low food cost. Canning was carried out on a more extensive scale, with the result that we were adequately stocked with canned goods when prices were advanced during the year. For planning the work of this project, credit is due to Mr. Carmichael and Mr. Hanau of our staff, who co-operated admirably in its execution. Here, too, we were fortunate to have the guidance of Mr. E. E. Workman of the House Committee.

I am indebted to the officers and members of the Board of Administration and Board of Trustees for their interested co-operation.

May I take this opportunity of recording my own personal thanks and appreciation to you, Mr. President, for the aid and advice you so readily accorded me at all times. To the departmental heads, professional and nonprofessional, for their loyal co-operation and help, I also wish to tender my sincere and grateful thanks. May I be permitted to record particularly my appreciation of the assistance so willingly given me throughout the year by the following members of the Administrative Staff:—Messrs. Segal and Gold-stein for their loyalty and devotion to the many details of their respective assignments; Miss Mendels, for her efficient conduct of the Nursing Department; Miss Goldman, for her efforts in maintaining the high standards of the Social Service Department; Mr. S. Bagan, for his careful supervision and control of the Hospital's Pharmacy; Mr. Hanau, for the enthusiasm he displays in the economical management of the Dietary Department; Mr. Carmichael, for his tireless and whole-hearted interest in maintaining the buildings and equipment in a maximum state of efficiency; Mrs. Magruder, for her selfless efforts in the Housekeeping and Laundry Departments. My grateful appreciation is due Mr. I. Blackman for his many services in connection with our Accounting Department. To the Medical, Interne and Nursing Staffs and to all employees of the Hospital, I extend my sincere thanks for their loyalty, cooperation and devotion to duty.

Recognizing that our patients are, on final analysis, the best critics of the humanitarian aspects of the Hospital's service, their views were never disregarded. We have been impressed by the spirit that the true humanitarian never becomes reconciled to suffering, and in consequence, kindness and consideration guide us in our relations with the sick. Our objective, as always, continues to be, to provide the best possible care to our patients.

WOMEN'S AUXILIARY

REPORT OF THE PRESIDENT

Fellow-Members of the Women's Auxiliary:

IT is with extreme gratification that I present for your approval this record of the fourth year of service by the Women's Auxiliary to the Jewish General Hospital.

Living as we are during the dark days of a war period so filled with increased responsibilities for every loyal citizen, it is satisfying to report that we continue to play our part on the home front. We recognize that "a nation's health is a nation's wealth", to quote the editorial inscription of one of our leading newspapers.

To examine the records for our contributions to the hospital during 1939 is a heart-warming experience. You have learned from our Treasurer's report that we had an expenditure of \$12,667.53. The mere appreciation of the amount involved is in itself a high tribute to the energy, devotion and support of the entire Women's Auxiliary. It stands as an impressive response from the generous hearts of our women to the needs of the hospital. Linen requirements during the year, together with the supplying of a large part of the linen requisition for 1940, made the greatest call upon our finances. Next came the reconstruction of the nursery, and its equipment with the most advanced provisions for the well-being of the new-born, including ultra-violet radiation and airconditioning. Life-saving measures and care and the supplying of necessary materials for the completion of the Respirator were further calls upon our resources. We provided fracture equipment, bakers, safety sides for beds, and photographic equipment. A silver polisher and additional silver flatware were purchased. New dispensary bottles were bought for clinic use, layettes were provided for the needy infants born in the hospital, and toys were distributed to the children in the wards during Chanukah. That, in brief, summarizes the calls made upon our finances. I shall deal further with the service of each committee and with what their efforts provided.

Having arrived at the reluctant decision that a formal ball could not be undertaken this season, we had the good fortune to receive the suggestion from Mrs. Charles Liebman of "Chain Entertainments".

Under the guidance of Mrs. Samuel Leopold and Mrs. Liebman, we launched a round of social events that delighted all who participated. We proudly announce the sum of \$2,404.50 realized, with an expense of \$59.00, thus leaving the handsome net total of \$2,345.50. This undertaking has been a thrilling experience, not only because of the amount realized, but because it established the place held by the hospital in the hearts and minds of the women of our community. At the same time, it gave to me personally the joy of realizing that it was the desire of our members that we continue to serve the hospital in the future in the same magnificent way as we had done in the past. The limitation of words prevents me from adequately expressing our appreciation to Mrs. Leopold, to Mrs. Liebman, and to all the ladies who served so faithfully, whether in clerical and telephone service, in the car service provided in the collection of the many donations that were offered, or in the social gatherings of our charming hostesses and their equally charming guests. I wish it were possible to mention each and every one personally, for each is deserving of a very personal message of appreciation. Your great recompense lies in the knowledge that, thanks to your combined efforts and generosity, the call of the hospital on the Women's Auxiliary will be answered. It is our hope to establish "Chain Entertainments" as our annual major money-raising event. We know that the community will not fail us.

Mrs. Allan Bronfman, chairman of the Life-Saving Fund, reports that the generous patronage of eighty-six ladies together with the receipt of many donations, made possible our meeting the requisitions for life-saving measures and special care for non-paying patients, without distinction. This service is profoundly appreciated by both hospital and patient. We are indebted to the devotion of our chairman, Mrs. Allan Bronfman, and to the generous response of the Patronesses to the Life-Saving Fund, for maintaining this vital service so necessary in meeting the urgent needs that arise. Not only are we grateful to Mrs. Bronfman for the inspiration she has given to this work, but we also extend our thanks to her for the maintenance of the beautiful tribute volume, as well as for a charming tea given in honour of the Patronesses. I must stress that upon your increased support depends the continued service of supplying blood-transfusions, special nursing, special drugs, oxygen, life-saving instruments, and other emergency needs.

Mrs. M. J. Raff, chairman of membership reports that 1,825 members and 41 associate members paid their dues in 1939, which includes 146 new members

who joined our ranks. To the Board Members and to a number of other ladies we are indebted for service in the collection of dues and in the enrolment of new members. This is by no means an easy task, and requires a spirit of cooperation and a thorough realization that a paid membership is our most worthwhile contributing force for the good and welfare of the hospital. Mrs. Raff's unfailing dependability, faithfulness to duty, and enthusiasm deserve our gratitude and sincere appreciation; she is indeed a tower of strength. We extend in turn to our devoted Board Members and to all who assisted Mrs. Raff our very warm thanks. We are indebted to Mrs. S. Hershon for valuable assistance in servicing our membership committee.

Mrs. Samuel Bronfman, chairman of ways and means, responded readily in the service and support of our undertakings. Her interest and co-operation have been a source of encouragement to me personally and of great benefit to the hospital. I extend to her our sincere appreciation.

Mrs. Harry Singer, chairman of meetings, has carried the responsibility of making arrangements for all meetings. Her cheerful response to the duties arising deserves our sincere thanks and my gratitude. We would here extend to Mrs. Allan Bronfman Jr. and to the ladies who assisted her, our appreciation for taking charge of tea at meetings.

Mrs. A. Raginsky Sr., chairman of publicity, has looked after our needs in the press and has thus kept our membership informed of our undertakings and activities. We offer her our many thanks and appreciation.

Mrs. Victor Michaels, treasurer and Miss Dorothy Hart, financial secretary, carry a tremendous responsibility in the care of all matters pertaining to our finances and accounts. They are doing a grand job, for both are dependable and efficient. Our hearty thanks is extended to them for their faithfulness to duty. We have full knowledge of the great demands made upon their time and patience. Our appreciation is also extended to Miss Gladys Hart for assuming, for one month the responsibility of financial secretary.

Mrs. David Tannenbaum, our esteemed corresponding secretary, reports that 15 Executive, 7 Board, and 4 General Meetings were held during 1939. Her correspondence entailed the sending of 1,225 notices for Board Meetings, and she was further called upon to write 318 letters to meet varying needs. Her constancy and ever pleasant response to the needs of the moment have been a great satisfaction to me personally, and have aided not a little in providing the assistance so necessary to the success of smooth management. We are grateful for such support. To Mrs. Maurice Greenblatt and Mrs. Max Rabinovitch has fallen the task of addressing over 10,000 notices for general meetings. We do appreciate such co-operation and service, and we extend to those ladies our many thanks. Mrs. S. Hershon as well merits our appreciation for her kind aid in tracing incorrect addresses and telephone numbers. It is well that I should bring to the attention of our members the importance of immediately notifying our secretary of change of address. Please bear in mind that we are entirely serviced by voluntary help.

Mrs. Lewis K. Freedman, our recording secretary, is always to be relied upon for a most interesting account of the proceedings of our meetings. She endows the minutes with a literary quality which gives them an added interest. To her is extended our very sincere appreciation.

Mrs. J. Greenberg and Mrs. A. M. Wener, co-chairman of the linen purchasing and sewing committee, report that all linen requirements were supplied and that 695 articles were sewn during 1939. The appreciation of an outlay of \$5,604.60 for purchases made in 1939 and for 1940 of linens, draperies, yard goods and uniforms for the staff, brings to mind the long hours necessary for their selection. The devotion of our co-chairman to the best interests of their department has always been a source of great gratification, and I extend to them and to all who rendered assistance to this committee our most grateful

thanks. A vote of thanks is also due to Mrs. J. Greenberg and Mrs. S. Fisher for the purchase of Chanukah gifts for the children.

Mrs. T. Percy Hirsch, chairman of the bottle and jar collection committee, reports a very successful year, thanks to her interest and to the splendid response of the community at large.

During 1939, 104,908 bottles and jars were collected realizing a gross of \$864.17, while entailing collection charges of \$162.58, thus leaving a net balance of \$701.59. This amount is greater by \$92.80 than that realized in 1938. The funds of this committee provided payments of \$295.14 for dispensary bottles, and it is a proud pleasure to announce that the surplus from this fund during 1938 and 1939 will provide new lighting equipment for one of the operating rooms at a cost of \$550.00. We would express our appreciation to Mrs. M. Gordon for her splendid assistance, and to a large committee whose devoted service contributed greatly to the success of this work. The co-operation of Mr. Brown of the Brown Bottle Exchange, and the support of Mr. Seltzer of the Notre Dame de Grace Kosher Butcher Shop, who aided in our collections, have been added factors in making for so splendid a report. To Mrs. Hirsch, who has given a fine devotion to the development and growth of this gratifying undertaking, we extend a sincere appreciation for a job splendidly performed. We would assure Mrs. Hirsch and all who have served this committee that we are proud of their accomplishment.

Mrs. J. Rubin and Mrs. J. Schulman, co-chairmen of the Children's Nursery Fund, report membership dues and donations totalling \$629.50. They can with justifiable pride tell you of providing \$200.00 for ultra-violet equipment for the newly reconstructed nursery and \$375.00 towards payment for the air-conditioning apparatus. They report a membership of 685 for 1939, and a balance on hand of \$72.48. In accordance with our slogan "no child is too young or too old to be a member of the Children's Nursery Fund", the youth of our community is responding with a fine interest in the needs of our sick little patients. During the summer, children in Trout Lake raised \$27.50, children of St. Donat donated \$7.00, and the children of Camp Hiawatha contributed \$25.00. This fine total of \$59.50 was gratefully received and acknowledged. Mrs. Rubin and Mrs. Schulman are to be congratulated on guiding with outstanding success the growth of an undertaking requiring such faithfulness of purpose and such intensive work on their part. We are not unaware of their need for the support of a larger group. The possibilities for growth in the membership of the Children's Nursery Fund are unlimited. We here extend sincere thanks to those ladies who have serviced this committee. We look back upon a delightful annual entertainment for our young members last summer. Their names continue to be inscribed in the lovely book kindly provided by Mrs. A. M. Wener.

Mesdames George Strean, Samuel Klein, S. Pesner, L. Miller, Saul Usher and Norman Viner, chairmen of the Surgical Dressings Committees, report 356,782 dressings made during 1939 and \$200.79 tea-money collected. On their behalf as well as my own, we express appreciation to the many ladies who have faithfully given their time to this much appreciated work. To the chairmen we give assurance of our gratitude for their devotion to duty. It is of interest to note that out of the funds of this tea-money the Chanukah toys for the children's wards are purchased.

Mrs. Jack Klein, chairman of the Layette Committee, reports that twenty-five needy new-borns received 600 articles of clothing adequate for their care and comfort. An expenditure of \$59.63 was made for 20 dozen diapers and 17 lbs. of wool, adding sufficient supplies to take care of needs for some time to come. We are indebted for the following donations: \$11.80 from Mrs. Marshall's group, \$2.44 from Mrs. Jack Klein, \$4.00 from Mrs. Shapiro's group for the purchase of wool, and \$4.50 realized by the sale of wool. Thus, thanks to these ladies, our expense for this department was reduced by \$22.74, making a net outlay of \$36.89. We not only express thanks to these ladies for their kind

donations, but we also extend our appreciation to more than fifty volunteer knitters, including a group at the Y.W.H.A. and also the 41st Montreal Ranger Co., Girl Guides of Neighborhood House, under Miss Daphne Montefiore. It is interesting to note that the Layette Committee has recently supplied knitting needles and wool to those of our little patients who are to be in the hospital over a long period. To Mrs. Jack Klein we extend a hearty vote of thanks for her devotion to the needs of the infants. Her interest is sincerely appreciated.

Mrs. H. Shiller, chairman of the Car Committee reports a limited activity in her department. Obtaining the use of volunteer cars has always been a difficult undertaking. We are grateful to Mrs. Shiller for her efforts.

Mrs. A. C. Benjamin as chairman of the Telephone Committee rendered a much appreciated service for which we extend many thanks.

Special mention must be made of Mrs. H. Levine, who not only kept our records of attendance at Board Meetings, but also took charge of tea tickets at General Meetings, Mrs. George Strean had the task of chairman of nominations together with a group of six ladies. For all these services we are grateful.

We record with regret the resignations from our Board of Mesdames Phillip Abbey, Phillip Fram, Rose Medine, H. Packer, Lawrence Sperber and Miss Etta Ambur. The Women's Auxiliary are grateful for their service and we trust that at some time in the future they may again find it possible to join our ranks.

We pay tribute to the memory of those who passed away during the year. Their absence is very much felt in our midst. To the bereaved families, we extend our profound sympathy.

Our meetings of the past year were distinguished by the famed personalities who graced our platform. Last January, the eminent author Fannie Hurst brought a record attendance to our meeting. The novelty of an evening meeting took place in March, when two interesting addresses were delivered by the President of the Hospital, Mr. Allan Bronfman and by Mr. Israel Rabinovitch, Editor of the Jewish Eagle. At our May meeting the Venerable Archdeacon A. P. Gower-Rees pointed The Way to Peace, and on November first the Honourable Marguerite Shaughnessy spoke to us on the Red Cross.

Our Honourary Auditors, I. Blackman and Co., once again served us well, and to them we express our gratitude and appreciation.

To Distillers Corporation we are indebted for housing us for Executive Meetings and during our very recent money-raising event. Theirs is true hospitality, for unlimited facilities are always arranged for our convenience. We would extend to the Y.M.H.A. our appreciation for the use of their hall on several occasions.

The Montreal Daily Star, the Gazette, the Canadian Jewish Chronicle, the Jewish Review and the Jewish Daily Eagle have rendered to us invaluable service in keeping our work and activities for the hospital before the public. We are sincerely grateful for their helpful co-operation.

No report of mine would be complete without an expression of appreciation to the President of the hospital, Mr. Allan Bronfman, and to the superintendent, Mr. S. S. Cohen, for their constructive advice and tangible efforts to lighten my responsibility. I am sincerely grateful.

In evaluating our fourth year of hospital service, I have the advantage and benefit of having attended the 41st Annual Meeting of the American Hospital Association in Toronto last September, and having heard there what similar volunteer hospital groups have contributed. While there are Women's Aids Associations who have been successful in raising greater funds and in giving more volunteer service, nevertheless ours is a record that sheds lustre upon

this Women's Auxiliary, and one which has gained recognition in the world of the hospital. It was my privilege to present a paper on "Can a Hospital Afford to be Without an Auxiliary?" which was accorded a splendid reception and which was given publication in the American Hospital Association's official organ, "HOSPITALS". I have since received a deluge of requests for copies of the paper from hospitals throughout the country. I could not pay you a greater tribute than to bring to your attention this mark of interest and approval.

Before closing, there are a few observations which I would like to make to the membership at large. First, know your hospital and how it is serving the community. Next, know your Women's Auxiliary and what it has done for the hospital, and acquaint yourself as to how you can best contribute to it in service and support. Pay your dues promptly to our financial secretary, and thus release the energy of the members of your Board for other service to the hospital. Your understanding, good-will and co-operation are essential if the Women's Auxiliary is to continue to be the great force for good that it has been during the past four years.

You have honoured me in your desire that I continue as your leader in 1940. For your loyalty and faithful co-operation, I am genuinely grateful.

Section 30 - Exemption for Religious Purposes, Etc.

"No duty shall be leviable on property devised or bequeathed for religious, charitable or educational purposes to be carried out in the Province of Quebec by a corporation or a society having an establishment within the Province of Quebec, or by a person resident in the Province of Quebec, nor on the amount of any unpaid subscription for any like purpose made by any person in his lifetime to any corporation, society or person mentioned in this section."
