# \*\*\* REPORT OF THE PRESIDENT\* \*\*\*

To the Governors of the Jewish General Hospital:

On Behalf of the Board of Administration, I have the honour to submit for your approval the Tenth Annual Report of the Hospital, for the year ended December 31st, 1943.

In the past year, despite increasing difficulties and handicaps imposed by a world at War, your Hospital has continued not only to render service in extensive volume to the Community, but has to a large extent maintained the usual high standards of that service. The problems of hospital administration in wartime are many and in common with Hospitals throughout the North American Continent we were faced with an increased demand for our services on the one hand, and a critical staff shortage on the other, which compelled us to impose limitations on the number of patients admitted to the Hospital. Nevertheless, admissions totaled 5,174, only 108 less than the record year of 1942. Patient days were 59,080 and represent a reduction of 3,933 days from the total recorded for the previous year. From the Superintendent's Report you will note that the average stay of patients was sharply reduced because of the necessity for a quick turnover of patients occasioned by the pressing and persistent demand for accommodation.

While the Revenue from Hospital operation was increased to \$302,716.19, it was inevitable that because of conditions over which we had no control, expenditures should also rise. Gross expenditures, including cost of certain improvements and provision for depreciation and replacements, totaled \$409,282.92, resulting in a gross operating deficit of \$106,566.73 for the year.

Non-operating revenue, consisting of income from the Combined Jewish Appeal, investments, donations and Governor's fees, amounted to \$102,122.72, which when deducted from the gross deficit, results in a net deficit for the year of \$4,444.01. Considering the difficulties encountered, we feel that the experience for the year may be looked upon with satisfaction.

Our Endowment Fund continues to meet with encouraging response on the part of the members of our Community, but wider recognition must be given to this means of assuring the Hospital's financial stability. It is gratifying to note that members of our Community are providing for our Hospital in their Wills. We should like, however, to emphasize the great satisfaction which comes from creating living Endowments which enable the contributor to observe and enjoy the results of his benefactions. We are pleased to record with gratitude the following additions to the Endowment Fund since our last Report:—

A further addition to the Endowment Fund of \$500.00 from Mr. and Mrs. Ben Wilanski is also gratefully recorded.

The foregoing is a brief summary of the year's highlights. Operating statistics in greater detail have been ably presented in the Superintendent's Report.

The year 1943 marks our tenth year of service to the Community and while discussing our activities for the year, it would seem opportune at the same time to review our accomplishments of the past decade.

^ Since that memorable Day, October 8th, 1934, when His Excellency Lord Bessborough, dedicated the Hospital and declared it open, a total of 41,361 patients were admitted to the various departments of the Hospital. Of this number, the majority were of course of Jewish Faith, but it is of interest to note that more than 2,500 were Roman Catholics, some 2,000 were Protestants and an additional 500 were of other faiths. I am sure we must all share the pride and satisfaction which comes from the knowledge that the Jewish Community of Montreal has made a distinct contribution to the health of our City, by creating and maintaining hospital facilities available to all without regard to race, creed or ability to pay for services rendered.

The more than 41,000 patients admitted account for a total of 522,608 days of treatment. Approximately 60% of our services were given to patients of the public wards. It is this generous public service which placed a severe strain on our finances by creating annual deficits, which in our earlier years of operation weighed heavily upon us. It is gratifying that in more recent years our Community has by increased contributions given evidence of its fuller appreciation of the importance of maintaining our Hospital at a point of maximum efficiency.

Our Out-Patient Department which through its various clinics gives treatment to those not in need of hospitalization and who cannot afford the services of a physician, accounted for 257,041 visits—more than half of which were made by patients who could not pay even the nominal charge for treatment. This vital service tends further to aggravate our annual operating losses.

The work of our Obstetrical Department continued to grow year after year and it now has to its credit a record of 7,219 babies born in the Hospital during the ten year period.

Brief reference to the volume of service rendered by the Hospital's Laboratories should prove of equal interest. The X-Ray Department carried out approximately 100,000 examinations, while the Clinical and Pathological Laboratories performed more than 250,000 procedures in the same period.

It is not possible to give you within the limitations of a Report of this nature, the complete statistics of ten years of active service. I feel however, that what we have presented to you, is ample indication that your Hospital has been a very busy place indeed during the past decade.

Whilst all of you are familiar with those functions of a Hospital which have to do with the care of the patient, we think it will be of interest to give you some insight into those activities which determine its scientific quality. From the very inception of our Hospital, we recognized the importance of developing scientific standards which would rank our Institution with the best on the Continent, and I give you here a brief review of what progress we have made in that direction.

In the first year our Hospital was, after due inspection, approved and commended by the American College of Surgeons and the American Hospital Association. At the same time we received approval for Intern Training from the Canadian and American Medical Associations. In 1939 our Hospital was selected by McGill University as one of 5 local hospitals where its medical graduates may take the required year of internship.

One of the functions of a good hospital is that of education. It must afford to physicians the opportunity to acquire a practical knowledge of the art and science of medicine. In any hospital in which disease is carefully investigated and treatment thoughtfully given, there is a certain educational by-product, and this constitutes medical education; but the Jewish General Hospital has gone beyond this in establishing a comprehensive educational program. The objectives of such a program are to bring to every staff physician a better knowledge of the newer developments in the ever expanding field of medicine, which ultimately redounds to the benefit of the patient.

The members of our Medical Staff have participated in numerous research problems and many of hem have made important contributions to the Medical Literature. At the conclusion of the current year, the Medical Board is planning to issue a Scientific Publication to mark the Tenth Anniversary of the Hospital's founding. The Publication will record original work carried on by members of the Staff and will list their contributions to the literature.

An important activity of the Hospital is the weekly "Clinical-Pathological" Conference attended by all members of the staff and a considerable number of visitors from the staffs of other hospitals. At these conferences, the Pathologist submits a comprehensive study of the pathological findings in all deaths and complicated cases, the aim being to correlate the clinical findings with the pathological. Such critical study is of great value in broadening the knowledge of our physicians.

A medium for moulding medical thought is the constant teaching of the interne by the attending staff. This is accomplished daily on "General Rounds" and weekly by the heads of departments on "Grand Rounds" when more detailed discussion is confined to selected cases.

The scientific and humanitarian interests of the attending staff are promoted by conferences which are held by the individual departments once a month and which deal in detail with an analysis of their work during the previous month. In these conferences there is open and free discussion by all members of the staff. The details of patients' illnesses and treatment given are analyzed in the hope of eliciting some new point of view, some improvement in methods from which the patients may benefit.

Our Hospital was amongst the first in this City to inaugurate a 'Tumor Clinic.' A group of specialists from the various departments, studies every case suspected of cancer or other tumor in an effort to establish the diagnosis and to determine the most efficacious form of treatment. The benefits accruing to the patients from such group study are inestimable. The Tumor Clinic is now one of the few in Canada which bear the approval of the American College of Surgeons.

Our Surgical and Medical Results compare favorably with those of the best medical centres. I cannot help but point with pride for example to our record in the Department of Obstetrics. With a total of more than 7,000 births, we have had the extreme good fortune to experience but 4 maternal deaths. This phenomenal result is equivalent to one fatality in 1,800 births,—one of the lowest maternal mortality rates on the North American Continent.

From this very abbreviated and sketchy outline of the scientific activities of our Hospital, you may learn that the medical staff is keenly and earnestly engaged in the promotion of medical science and the teaching to others of knowledge which they have been able to acquire by virtue of their connection with this progressive institution of learning. This important public service could not be given without the sympathetic support of a generous community, whose interest and vision have encompassed a much wider field of usefulness than is concerned merely with the beneficent care of the sick and which recognizes that a hospital's work is not really complete unless it disseminates the knowledge gained in the care of patients, to others similarly engaged. I am happy to pay tribute to the members of the Medical Staff for their active co-operation in maintaining the high standards of the Hospital and in promoting its scientific progress and development.

In this, the fifth year of a nation engulfed in a global war, we may point with pride to the contributions we have made to the war effort. Many of the key members of our Medical Staff have answered the call of the Armed Forces. More than 50 of our younger doctors who received their training as interns from our Hospital are now serving with the Army, Navy and Air Force. Many of our Nurses and other personnel have entered various branches of the Service. Our Staff has participated actively in every patriotic undertaking.

The provision of adequate medical care for the producers of the materials of war, thereby maintaining morale on the Home Front, is an additional contribution to the war effort, the value of which must not be underestimated.

Thus far we have but stated our accomplishments without reference to those things which through force of circumstances and conditions, we have been prevented from doing. It is in the very nature of the Scientific Hospital that it make progress continously, else it must face the dangers of stagnation and ultimate disintegration. In the past ten years we have made the fullest use of our opportunities to advance the scientific stature of our Hospital. We have now reached a stage in our development where, because of our limited facilities, we can advance no further. If we are to continue to fulfill our obligations to our Community and maintain our position as a Scientific Hospital we must embark on a comprehensive expansion program. An Institution with such a proud beginning can safeguard its precious past only by being fully prepared to meet the challenge of the future.

For the past few years it has been obvious to your Board of Administration that our Hospital was in urgent need of added facilities and reference to our various needs has been made from time to time. Recent experiences in hospitalization have shown a steady increase in the demands for hospital accommodation. This upward trend is due to several causes which may be summarized briefly as follows:

#### 1. DEVELOPMENTS IN MEDICAL PRACTICE

The growing complexity of methods used in the diagnosis and treatment of disease and the highly specialized equipment and facilities required for these procedures, have brought an ever increasing number of patients into hospitals each year. It is becoming increasingly difficult for the physician to investigate and treat a patient outside of the hospital. This factor alone has contributed substantially to the higher degree of hospital utilization.

#### 2. PUBLIC EDUCATION

Through education, the public has come to better understand the hospital and no longer displays any fear of it. The public accepts the Hospital as a necessary part of maintaining community health. Patients enter promptly and eagerly when advised to do so.

# 3. BLUE CROSS PLANS

The ability to purchase hospitalization voluntarily for a fixed and predetermined fee, has captured the imagination of the public. The knowledge that hospital care is provided for without accepting charity or going into debt, encourages early treatment and has brought added thousands into our hospitals, who otherwise might not have received adequate care.

#### 4. ECONOMIC IMPROVEMENT

Increased earning power of the average person encourages the seeking of medical advice and adds further to the utilization of hospitals.

At no time has the City of Montreal had an excessive number of hospital beds. With the advent of War, and the resultant increase of the

population and because of the other factors just mentioned, our local Hospitals are wholly incapable of meeting the full demands of the public. It seems clear that Hospitals generally must plan extension of their facilities and your Board of Administration has given serious study to this problem.

Whilst planning additional beds to increase our capacity, we must also plan for the expansion of those facilities which we found inadequate from the very beginning of the Hospital. Accordingly we must provide adequate space for laboratories, X-Ray and other diagnostic departments as well as for additional operating rooms, and other necessary services.

The need for establishing a Training School for Nurses, has been referred to on several occasions and there is general agreement on the necessity for so doing. This phase of the expansion program will, when carried out, meet a pressing need of our Hospital and further raise the prestige of our Community by establishing the Dominion's first Nurses' Training School under Jewish Auspices.

In the light of the foregoing, your Board of Administration has in the past few months conducted a survey to determine more accurately our actual needs. As a result of this study, and based upon it, we have had prepared preliminary plans. These are now before us and briefly provide for the following:

- A Nurses' Home capable of accommodating 150 Nurses and including complete Training School facilities.
- 2. A Lecture Theatre to serve the Hospital Staff as well as the Nurses' Training School.
- 3. Expanded facilities and modern animal quarters for the Pathological Laboratories.
- 4. Additional space for X-Ray.
- 5. Additional Operating and Case Rooms.
- One Hundred additional beds, which will enable us to increase our accommodations for public, semi-private and private patients.

We have in the past, on more than one occasion, recorded our appreciation to the Provincial Government and the City of Montreal for their financial help in our first building project. I am confident that our record of service and their appreciation of the need for added hospital facilities, will once again inspire their sympathetic consideration.

In my report for last year, I expressed the opinion that National Health Insurance appeared to be approaching adoption in Canada. While it has not yet become law, it has, nevertheless, been brought closer to realization. What effect such legislation may have on the future of the Voluntary Hospital, is difficult, to visualize. We can however derive comfort from the knowledge, that the implementation of National Health

Insurance, will come within the jurisdiction of the Provincial Government, whose broad social planning has brought distinction to its members and bestowed wide benefits on the people of the Province. Our able and distinguished Minister of Health and Social Welfare, the Honourable Henri Groulx, whom we are privileged and honoured to have as our guest tonight, has played a vital role in the tremendous progress which has been made in our Province in the field of health and social welfare.

I think it may be said that Dr. Groulx is one of those who is fully appreciative of the important position which the Voluntary Hospitals occupy in the health of the Province. The history of the Voluntary Hospitals is one of continuous progress. For several hundred years they have distinguished themselves by the quality of their work, their adaptability and their progressiveness. Not long ago, the Honourable Minister was quoted substantially as stating that it was not the Government's function to operate Hospitals, its obligation being to enable the existing recognized Hospitals to carry on their work and to assist them whenever possible. This significant statement is assurance that under such intelligent and progressive administration, our Voluntary Hospitals will flourish and continue to make their full contribution to the health of our people.

Before concluding this Report, I should like to express our thanks and appreciation to all those who by their service, co-operation and contributions made possible the work which we have reviewed. To the members of the Board of Administration and Board of Trustees, and to the various committees, I tender my appreciation for their support. Throughout the past ten years, their unity of purpose and complete devotion to the ideal of service to the under privileged, have been an inspiration. Our thanks are due to our legal advisers, Messrs. Weinfield and Rudenko and to our Honorary Notary, Mr. H. E. Hershorn. We record our gratitude to the Jewish Public Library for continuing to make their facilities available to our patients.

To the English and Jewish Press we are deeply grateful for their continued co-operation.

To the personnel of the Hospital's many Departments, we convey our appreciation for their devotion to duty under difficult and trying conditions.

Since the inception and even before our doors were open to the public, we have been fortunate in having the guidance of a capable and efficient superintendent in the operation of our Hospital. Mr. Cohen has shown himself to be an able administrator with wide knowledge of hospital management. His loyalty, devotion and guidance have been important factors in the progress and development of our Tribute Everlasting and the maintenance of its high standards. To Mr. Cohen and his capable administrative staff we record our deep appreciation.

The Women's Auxiliary has again magnificently fulfilled the obligations it assumed. Year after year its membership has grown until today it numbers well over 2,500. It also has a Junior Membership of over 400 and in addition a Nursery Fund which with an eye to the future enrols new-born babies and already has a membership of over 1,700. Permit me also to make brief reference to the phenomenal growth of the Life Saving Fund. The Honour Roll which now adorns the walls of the entrance foyer to the Hospital is a silent tribute to the generosity of the women whose names are inscribed thereon.

To Mrs. Alton Goldbloom, President, we again express our admiration and thanks for the fine leadership she continues to give to the Auxiliary. To the Officers, Committees, Patronesses and Membership at large we tender our sincere appreciation for their splendid support. The Women's Auxiliary has throughout the years indeed been a tower of strength and an indispensable part of our growth and progress.

To-night we have reviewed the past and tried to give you some insight into our plans for the future. We are confident, that when our expansion program is presented to the members of our Community, their approval will manifest itself with the same generous spirit which created our Tribute Everlasting and that with their encouragement and support the challenge of the future will be met with resolute determination, and in a manner that will raise our prestige and our pride and redound to the credit of our people.

# AUDITORS' REPORT

Gentlemen:

We have audited the books and records of the Jewish General Hospital for the year ended December 31st, 1943, and present herewith our report:

Included herewith are the following Statements:-

BALANCE SHEET as at December 31st, 1943.

STATEMENT OF INCOME AND EXPENSES—HOSPITAL OPERATIONS for the year ended December 31st, 1943.

STATEMENT OF NON-OPERATING INCOME—for the year ended December 31st, 1943.

RECONCILIATION OF CAPITAL ACCOUNT—as at December 31st, 1943. Building Fund Account—for the year ended December 31st, 1943.

Vouchers for all disbursements have been duly examined and all financial transactions have been verified. Your Bankers have confirmed Bank balances by means of certificates. Cash on Hand, cheques, and notes have been duly verified and checked. Securities have been verified by actual examination and by certificate of the depositaries. Inventories are shown in accordance with figures submitted by your Superintendent.

The sum of \$25,435.75 of Investments, previously carried in the General Accounts, has been transferred to Building Fund Accounts and is included in the Investments as shown in the said Building Fund Account on your Balance Sheet.

There is, in addition to liabilities shown on your Balance Sheet, a deferred liability of \$13,300.00 for expropriation taxes to the City of Montreal. This amount is payable, plus interest in nine equal instalments, annually. A contingent liability in respect of the issue of \$300,000.00 of 5% serial Debentures, due 1932-1951, by the Jewish Hospital Campaign Committee Inc., and guaranteed as to principal and interest by the Government of the Province of Quebec, remains outstanding to the amount of \$155,500.00.

Your Statement of Income and Expenses on Hospital Operations for the year 1943 indicates a net operating loss of \$106,566.73.

Net Non-Operating Income for the year 1943 represented by contributions to Maintenance Funds, Investment Income, Donations, Memberships, etc. amounted to \$102,122.72.

Net Income from pledges to Building Fund during the year 1943

amounted to \$17,875.30.

Subject to the foregoing, we certify that the attached statements correctly set forth the position of the Jewish General Hospital as on December 31st, 1943 and the results of the operations for the year ended December 31st, 1943, according to the best information and the explanations and information given us, and as shown by your books and records.

We desire to express our deep appreciation to your Superintendent, Mr. S. S. Cohen, to Mr. M. Segal, and to Mr. Frederick M. Goldstein, as well as to your office staff, for the kind co-operation and assistance

rendered us during the course of our audit.

# REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT\*

Mr. Allan Bronfman, President, Jewish General Hospital, Montreal. Sit:

I have the honour to submit for your approval the Tenth Annual Report of the Superintendent for the year ended December 31st, 1943.

The year under review reveals that the Jewish General Hospital once again rendered a large volume of service to our Community and City. Admissions for the year totaled 5,174, a reduction of 108 from the previous year, while patient days were 59,080, a decrease of 3,933. These reductions must not be taken as an indication of any slackening in the demand for the Hospital's services. The contrary is actually the situation. Demand for accommodation in all categories—private, semi-private and public—is greatly increased and waiting lists were maintained throughout the year.

The reduction in occupancy resulted from the necessity to restrict admissions because of our inability to secure the staff necessary to give adequate care to a larger number of patients. This distressing situation is by no means limited to our Hospital, as many of the local institutions have been compelled to impose similar restrictions on admissions. With demands for Hospital service growing each year and staff becoming more difficult to secure, our Hospitals are faced with a critical situation. Unfortunately, the solution does not appear to be in sight. Meanwhile, all possible expedients calculated to make our services available to the greatest numbers consistent with reasonably adequate care, have been adopted. The Medical Staff has co-operated by referring only those patients who were in urgent need of hospitalization and who could not be cared for in their homes. Patients were discharged earlier than under normal conditions and returned home for convalescence whenever possible. As a result, the average stay of patients was reduced to 11.4 days as compared with 13.6 days in 1939.

Classification of patients reveals that there has been an increase in the number of private and semi-private patients and a reduction in the

number of public ward patients hospitalized.

The Out-Patient Department recorded 25,288 visits, a decrease from the number of visits for the previous years—a further indication of the continued improvement in the economic status of the population.

The Institutional mortality rate was reduced from 2.2% for the pre-

vious year to 1.8%.

Operations totaled 3,039 - a slight decrease from the previous year.

The Medical Board and the Medical Staff carried out their respective duties and responsibilities in a highly commendable manner. Their whole-hearted interest and co-operation made possible this splendid record of service, and I want to express to all of them my deep appreciation for their unfailing support. During the year, meetings of the Medical Staff were continued at which time your Superintendent reviewed and discussed matters of mutual interest pertaining to the administration of the Hospital. In addition, members of the Staff presented papers of scientific interest. The regular Departmental, Clinical-Pathological, X-Ray and

Tumour Conferences were continued and have done much to promote the scientific standing of our Hospital. It is a tribute to the members of the Medical Staff that they have found time to maintain all these important activities in the face of the greatly increased demands being made on them by their patients.

The Laboratories continue to fulfill the many requests of the Clinical Departments under the handicap of inadequate facilities referred to in reports for previous years. The proposed program for expansion will, it is hoped, provide adequate facilities for carrying out not only the increased volume of routine work but also for the conduct of research problems consistent with the scientific development of our Hospital.

The work of the X-Ray Department continues to increase and becomes more difficult to execute in the limited quarters assigned to it. That the increased volume of work was accomplished with such efficiency is a tribute to the personnel of the Department. The need for additional space is urgent and here too the expansion program is calculated to create modernized and increased facilities to meet the growing requirements of present day practice.

In the Obstetrical Department a total of 1,047 births was recorded, an increase of 57 from the record year of 1942. It is again a matter of deepest gratification to be able to report that this large service was accom-

plished without experiencing a maternal death.

The Nursing Department has suffered further from the loss of many of its members to the Armed Forces as well as through other resignations. The Nursing situation is particularly acute and was in the main responsible for the necessity to restrict admission to the Hospital. That we were able to give such excellent nursing care to so large a number of patients is a tribute to the loyalty of those members of the Nursing Staff who remained and assumed their added responsibilities with selfless devotion and humanitarianism so characteristic of their profession. We owe to all of them a debt of sincere gratitude and I am happy to pay them this well-merited recognition.

As in past years, the Women's Auxiliary continued to serve with distinction. The Life Saving Fund met all demands made on behalf of the public ward patients. The Volunteer Service organized and maintained by the Auxiliary has rendered important assistance in all Departments of the Hospital. We are deeply grateful to all those who by their voluntary efforts enabled us to maintain a high standard of service to our patients. To Mrs. Alton Goldbloom, President of the Auxiliary, to the Officers, Committees and membership at large, I express my sincere appreciation and thanks for their sympathetic interest and energetic support.

The Dietary Department experienced great difficulty in securing adequate staff and our volunteers contributed materially to its ability to render good dietary service. We regret to report the resignation of Miss Anne Berry, Chief Dietitian for the past 8 years. Miss Naomi Perchanok, Miss Berry's able assistant, has been appointed Chief Dietitian and has amply proven the confidence we have placed in her. The installation of

new dishwashing equipment secured after a considerable delay, has relieved a bad situation. Dishwashing is now effective and efficient. With the splendid co-operation of volunteers from the Auxiliary, large scale preserving and canning was again carried out. To all the members of the Dietary Staff we owe our appreciation for the efficient manner in which they discharge their difficult duties.

The Housekeeping and Laundry Departments were equally affected by staff difficulties. They nevertheless, through hard work of the reduced staff, effectively maintained their vital services.

The plant, equipment and grounds continue to be maintained in a satisfactory manner.

The use of coal as a fuel has proven inefficient for our plant and we were greatly pleased to be advised that fuel oil was again available. Reconversion to burning heavy fuel oil is now in progress and the use of oil will commence as soon as our present supply of coal is consumed. We were fortunate in that we made a minimum expenditure in converting to coal and our loss will be relatively small in reverting back to oil.

The average per capita cost, for all patients, based upon charging all operating expenditures to in-patients was \$6.14 as compared with \$5.66 for the year 1942. The increase in operating cost is accounted for by the following factors:

Increased pay rolls

Higher cost of foods and supplies, and the necessity to operate at less than capacity for the reasons stated earlier in the report.

I wish again to express my deep and sincere gratitude to my associates and co-workers for the splendid co-operation they continue to give me and for their unfailing devotion to their respective tasks. To the Intern and Resident Staff in general and to Dr. Moe Siminovitch, Chief Intern, in particular, I want to pay a special tribute for the co-operation they have given me throughout the year.

To Dr. D. L. Mendel and the many members of the Staff who assisted him, we are indebted for the splendid health service rendered our employees.

To you, Mr. President, and to your associates on the Board of Administration I want to say how grateful I am for your constant co-operation. I want to make particular reference to the honour accorded me by the Board on the occasion of the tenth anniversary of my association with the Hospital. The day will linger long in my memory as one of the most pleasant and satisfying experiences of my career. I sincerely hope that I may continue to merit your confidence.

The year covered by this Report was one of activity, anxiety and at times disappointment. We feel however, that in our efforts to maintain a high standard of service, we have met with reasonable success. The inability to make our services available to all who seek them is our greatest concern. The complete solution of this problem must await the day of Victory, when the difficulties created by a dreadful War may be dispelled and we may once again devote our full energies to the problems of peace and reconstruction. God speed the day!

# WOMEN'S AUXILIARY

#### REPORT OF THE PRESIDENT\*

Bidding farewell to a passing year is always an occasion for reflection, appraising and evaluating the past record and planning the future with an eye to giving improved and added aid to burdened humanity. It has been impressively said that individuals must give allegiance to the general welfare, if the future is to achieve a better social order. I would suggest by this our eighth annual account, which herewith follows, that the Women's Auxiliary of the Jewish General Fospital Inc. has made a dis-

tinct effort to give expression to the wisdom of that philosophy.

Our financial statement shows that for 1943 we raised \$10,866.75 largely through membership dues, and that we incurred a total expenditure of \$10,111.21. It will be noted that our expenditures were very much confined to the provision of linens at a cost of \$3,665.74, and meeting an expanded program for life-saving measures at an outlay of \$4,063.55. We must bear in mind that the hospital needs are greater today than they have ever been, but we are very much at a standstill to meet the requirements because of wartime restrictions, priorities and limitation on the manufacture of equipment. I would here stress that at the available moment, our present monetary holdings will quickly vanish. Therefore, we must continue to build our finances to meet the coming of a better day. Let our motto be "Health for All". Let us strive and be prepared to make possible a better health program for all Canadians. Cnly then can we have a Canada at work and at peace, each making his contribution towards building a land where prosperity and happiness would become the inalienable right of each dweller in our midst.

Mrs. Allan Bronfman, as chairman of our Life Saving Fund, directs a service to the hospital that reflects in its development, the motive power and the inspiration of her great personal devotion. In 1943 our 245 patronesses contributed \$6,350.00 in support of this humanitarian work. It is interesting to note that while 238 contributed \$25.00 each, 6 gave \$50.00 each, and one gave \$100.00. Added to this was \$391.50 donated in varying amounts of fifty cents and upwards demonstrating the wide appeal of this cause. The Life Saving Fund has been further augmented by a handsome donation of \$500.00 from Mr. and Mrs. Maurice Gross for the creation of a Penicillin Fund. We also gratefully acknowledge a generous donation of \$100.00 from Mr. and Mrs. Harry

Tarshis in celebration of their thirtieth wedding anniversary.

In the true interpretation of life saving, we must explore every avenue that can bring light and scientific aid to the prolongation of life in health and happiness. With this principle in mind, we have watched the growth of the Hospital and its limitation of space in all departments. The need for expansion in the near future has become evident and we have set aside a nucleus of a laboratory building fund of \$7,500.00 to which we can add the \$3,000.00 raised for a Blood and Plasma Bank and held in a separate fund by the hospital. An expenditure of \$2,903.28 was spent to meet the many requisitions for life saving measures and the emergency needs of our sick poor, without regard to race or creed, providing them with blood

transfusions, oxygen, serum, sulfa-drugs, insulin, vitamins, and special nursing care. We have maintained our annual contribution of \$800.00 to the obstetrical clinics, and \$260.00 for the provision of insulin in the outpatient department. We have also expanded our life-saving work by providing a social service worker for the tumour clinic at an annual salary of \$1,200.00

I must stress that our extensive maintenance of life saving measures remains dependent upon a continued and increased support from a generous public. To those who have done this great beneficence, we express heartfelt gratitude on behalf of the countless recipients, the hospital staff and Board of Administration. Not only to those who have given so willingly of their purse but to all who have devoted themselves in the encouragement of this work, we express our highest regard and appreciation. Mrs. David Tannenbaum is deserving of a special measure of thanks for her assistance in recording and acknowledging the donations of this fund. We know that our chairman, Mrs. Allan Bronfman, feels adequately rewarded when her vigorous appeal is generously answered. Faithfulness and devotion have ever been her guide; we give to her the expression of our high regard for her accomplishment. One can best appreciate the intensive application that our chairman made to insure the expansion and usefulness of the fund, when we study its progressive growth. In 1936 we had 33 patronesses; in 1937 we had 51; in 1938 we had 61; in 1939 we had 85; in 1940 we had 108; in 1941 we had 140; in 1942 we had 185; in 1943 we had 245; and to date for 1944, 89 new subscribers have pledged their generosity to the continuance of this noble endeavour.

Mrs. M. J. Raff, chairman of Membership, by her unwavering devotion is in great measure responsible for the maintenance of our imposing strength of paid membership. Our records show at this time of writing, that 2,003 are senior members in good standing. As a result of a recent campaign 376 new members have joined our ranks for 1944. It is a stimulating experience to study our membership records since our birth in January, 1936. The end of the year 1937 found us with 2,004 members and 81 associates (out of town); in 1938 we had 1,866 and 50 associates; in 1939 we had 1,866 and 48 associates; in 1940 we had 1,805 and 53 associates; 1941 we had 1,807 and 43 associates; in 1942 we had 1,985 and 40 associates; and in 1943 we had 2,003 and 37 associates. These figures are inclusive of patronesses who are senior members. It is important that we recognize that moneys derived from senior membership dues provided the funds for the payment of linens; \$500.00 for instrument replacements and takes financial care of all requisitions other than life-saving as well as office and other expenses. The foregoing record is a monumental tribute to Mrs. Raff, to our Board of Directors, past and present, and to the membership at large. It has ever been our aim to build on the firm foundation of strength of numbers as the best assurance of our contribution to the Hospital. Mrs. Raff's co-operation and faithfulness find answer in the results attained. We pay to her the tribute that is her due, knowing that

the gratification of a work well done is her great reward. Interested always, ever loyal to the voluntary service ideal that guides the Women's

Auxiliary, Mrs. Raff remains a tower of strength.

Mrs. H. Singer and Mrs. William Riven as chairmen of Voluntary Service were called upon to plan a program of increased aid to the Hospital in many departments. We found it necessary to establish a Women's Auxiliary office in the Hospital with a permanent secretary in charge in order to insure a measure of dependable assistance. It is gratifying to report that we have not failed the hospital in her hour of need. Without the response of our volunteers, the canning and preserving of the hospital produce could never have been accomplished. We have been and are supplying volunteers daily for the wards, dining rooms and clinics and these ladies are winning the constant commendation of the staff. To all who have and who are giving of their time and energy, we extend a hearty vote of thanks and the assurance that their devotion is highly appreciated. And to Mrs. Singer and to Mrs. Riven we give our sincere appreciation for their fine contribution to this important work. Mrs. Singer merits my personal gratitude for her cheery co-operation in facilitating many of the needs that arise.

Mrs. David Tannenbaum, chairman of publicity, has given to her responsibilities a dependability and sincere attention that ever call forth our warmest appreciation. Every avenue of information has been explored by our chairman in order to keep our large membership in touch with our activities. We are deeply grateful to Mrs. Tannenbaum for such invaluable service, and we would here express our sincere appreciation to the Star, the Gazette, the Canadian Jewish Chronicle, the Canadian Jewish Review, the Jewish Daily Eagle, the Herald, Burnett's Town Crier, the Monitor and the Westmount Examiner for their generous and

cordial co-operation.

Mrs. Victor Michaels, our Treasurer, and Miss Dorothy M. Hart, our financial secretary, are sharing in the task and burden of administering our finances. Their efficiency and devotion commands our highest admiration. When we give thought to the payment of accounts in an organization as large as ours, and the handling of well over 2,000 member ship dues, we are immediately aware of the immensity of the labour it entails. Mrs. Michaels and Miss Hart are making a distinguished contribution of service and we extend to them the assurance that theirs is a valued part of our organization which has won for them our warmest

tribute and commendation.

Mrs. L. K. Freedman, Mrs. George Strean and Mrs. Z. I. Diner have in their secretarial capacities fulfilled their obligations of office with a devotion that is invaluable to the general efficiency of good management. It is no light responsibility to serve an organization dedicated to the creation of good will amongst its subscribers in the interest of hospital welfare. A minute attention to detail has contributed notably to the business and smooth running of our affairs. Mrs. Freedman has maintained excellent records of our meetings; while Mrs. Strean and Mrs. Diner have shared capably in the duties of corresponding secretaries. Mrs. Strean reports the sending of 105 letters while Mrs. Diner was responsible for the mailing of 10,900 notices for Board and General meetings. To all three ladies our warmest thanks for their loyalty and devotion.

Mrs. J. Rubin and Mrs. J. Schulman, as co-chairmen of our Children's nursery Fund, present a record of achievement, that holds an honoured place in our hearts and minds. Their appeal is to the babies and children of our community under 16 years of age, which calls for a sympathetic response on the part of parents. The close of 1943 finds this fund with a membership of 1,510, of whom 408 were newly enrolled this year. Disbursements were limited, due to wartime restrictions; \$450.00 was expended on the needs of the non-paying newborns in the hospital; \$114.76 provided for layettes for poor infants and general expenses. Our chairmen are deeply appreciative of the devotion and co-operation of the members of the Board, and make particular reference to Mrs. J. Goldenberg, whose loyalty and service are deserving of special mention. We acclaim Mrs. Rubin and Mrs. Schulman for their magnificent report, realizing as we do how much depends upon their guidance and wholehearted interest. They can be happy in their knowledge of their excellent record and we know we can depend on them to make 1944 a record year in the life of the Children's Nursery Fund.

Mrs. Jack Klein, who heads our Layette Committee, reports that 14 needy babies were provided with Layettes during the year. These gifts are truly a boon to the newborn and a comfort to the poor mother. Each layette bundle consists of:—3 sweaters, 2 bonnets, 2 pair bootees, 3 shirts, 2 blankets, 3 nighties and 24 diapers. Our chairman's contribution of service is not limited to supervision but is constantly evidenced by devotion and generosity, which is not always found in the record. We are sincerely grateful for her ever present thought to the cause of the infants. We make grateful acknowledgment to Mrs. Klein today for the handsome silver wine goblet and tray, which will be won by some fortunate paid

member for 1944.

We wish to thank Mrs. Max Usher, Mrs. William Gavsie and Mrs. I. Levitt for donations received. Those who have contributed their knitting services, Mrs. Max Fineberg, Mrs. T. Hoffman, Mrs. J. Kupfer, Mrs. H. J. Hyman, Mrs. Albert Weiner, Mrs. Harry Cohen, Miss Rose Silverstone, Mount Sinai Unit under Mrs. Shelby Ray; Neighborhood House Mothers Club, and Neighborhood House Ranger Company, under Miss Daphne Montefiore, are here accorded our best thanks.

Mrs. A. M. Wener and Mrs. M. Greenblatt, co-chairmen of the Linen purchasing Committee, report an expenditure of \$3,665.74, on hospital linens, inclusive of uniforms for the staff. It has been a task to fill the required needs with any measure of success. Without the co-operation of Mr. Jack Klein the difficulties encountered by our chairmen would have been manifold. Mrs. Wener and Mrs. Greenblatt have given sincere loyalty to their responsibilities and we extend to them not only our very warm thanks but also the grateful appreciation of the staff of the Hospital.

Mrs. M. Gordon, chairman of the Bottle and Jar Collection Committee, happily reports a slight increase in the net amount realized from their sale over the preceding year. While we have been faced with many problems of collection, it is gratifying to report the gross income was \$617.36—our cartage costs were \$223.33, leaving a net balance of \$394.03. Without the continued generous co-operation of Mr. Browns of the Browns Bottle Exchange, we could not have carried on. We wish to give Mr. Browns assurance that we are sincerely grateful for this continued

support in this undertaking. To Mrs. Gordon we would extend our hearty thanks for her devotion to this activity, so productive of interest in Hospital welfare. Thanks to this available fund we supplied new dispensary bottles at a cost of \$143.33, leaving a surplus to be applied to some much needed surgical equipment. The road Mrs. Gordon has travelled has not been easy, but the results justify the expenditure of time, thought and energy. We know that we can count on Mrs. Gordon to

carry on to greater success.

Mrs. Moe Segal, chairman of our Juniors, has devoted herself unselfishly to the guidance, welfare and growth of this newest addition to our family of members. We recognize how difficult is the co-ordination of effort in the life of a new group such as this. Our Juniors had ten executive and six general meetings, each of considerable interest and productive of a growing enrollment in the home nursing, first aid, and V.A.D. courses. The meetings were extremely colorful in their well-planned programmes. An Information Please session, with a group of High School teachers as experts, was highly stimulating; headed by Miss Catherine Mackenzie, principal of the Girls High School, and assisted by Miss Ruby Hopkins, Miss Smiley, Miss Flanz and Miss Frazier. At another meeting, a Quiz Program was arranged by Miss Beth Tannenbaum, with Miss Mona Bronfman and Miss Kay Silver contributing most delightful readings. The Juniors are greatly indebted to Mrs. Allan Bronfman for a charming 1944 paid membership tea, at which she was hostess. At the closing meeting of the season, the Juniors heard a most interesting address by Mrs. Gershon Levi.

It is gratifying to report that the 1944 membership to date is 425 and that one young lady, Miss Beatrice Cohen, personally signed up 101 new members and won Mrs. Segal's beautiful prize. Our Juniors continue to carry the annual responsibility of a contribution of \$250.00 to our Medical Library, and they have made additional gifts of medical books to the hospital to honour their president, Miss Beatrice Kirsch, Mrs. Lloyd Stern, Miss Mackenzie, and the high school teachers who participated in
