# REPORT OF THE PRESIDENT

## To the Governors of The Jewish General Hespital:

On behalf of the Board of Administration, I have the honour to submit for your approval the Fifteenth Annual Report for the year ended December 31st, 1948.

On October 8th, 1934, the Jewish General Hospital became a reality when its doors were thrown open to the public and it was dedicated to the service of the ill and the injured regardless of race, creed or financial status. To-day, we bring you a Report of unusual achievement which will warm the hearts of those who participated in the creation of this house of healing and give great satisfaction to all who follow its progress.

From the statistical report of the Superintendent, you will have noted that the year 1948 was the most active in the history of our Hospital. The demands on our services continue to grow and I should like to dwell a few moments on some of the causes which in the past vear contributed to this growth. Our City is expanding generally and our Community is keeping pace with this expansion. During the year 1948, many thousands of our co-religionists have come to the shores of Canada through the gracious co-operation of our Dominion Government. They came from the D.P. camps of Europe after having endured and survived the unbelievable cruelties and hardships of the Concentration Camps. Recognizing that good health is essential to the rapid integration of these new Canadians into the life and fabric of our Community, our services were made freely available to all who needed them. Medical care rendered to these new arrivals contributed largely to our increased volume of service in the Hospital proper as well as in the out-patient clinics and accounts for a considerable portion of our deficit for the year. We are happy and proud to be permitted to play such an important role in the rehabilitation of so many new Canadians by restoring them to sound health and enabling them to become happy, useful and productive citizens.

The non-sectarian character of our Hospital continues to be demonstrated in that more than 25% of our services were again given to patients of non-Jewish faith.

Mounting annual deficits continue to be the great concern of your Board of Administration. The rising cost of rendering good patient care according to modern accepted standards and the inability to retrieve from patients the full cost of this care, is occupying the attention of all voluntary Hospitals. That the Provincial Government has so far not recognized that a basis of payment for indigent patients established in 1942 is no longer adequate in these days of higher costs, places an added burden on our Hospitals which, in fairness, they should not be required to carry. The considerable losses incurred through the operation of Out-Patient Departments, must again be brought to the attention of Municipal and Provincial authorities. Both Governments should give prompt and serious consideration to the repeated representations made by Hospitals seeking increased payment for the care of indigents. I am certain that the Government of this great Province of Quebec which has amply demonstrated its interest in public health, will recognize the urgency and necessity for preserving the high standards of care rendered by the Hospitals of our Province, by compensating them more realistically under the Quebec Public Charities Act and by making grants towards the maintenance of out-patient Departments.

We are fortunate indeed that our generous Community each year contributes sufficient funds through Combined Jewish Appeal to offset the major portion of our operating deficit. In the year 1948, the Combined Jewish Appeal was ably and effectively led by Mr. Samuel Moskovitch, K.C. To him and to the entire Campaign Organization, we express our appreciation for their splendid achievement.

We again wish to emphasize the importance of building up our Endowment Fund. The future security of our Hospital can be assured by the development of a fund sufficient to protect us against the uncertainties of annual fund raising. That this objective cannot be quickly accomplished, must be quite obvious. Yet, it is gratifying to report that some progress has been made in that direction. Of particular interest is the increasing

tendency on the part of our leading citizens to create living Endowments and I should like to record a word of special appreciation and thanks to the following members of our Community who have made gifts to the Endowment Fund since our last report.

I should like to refer at this time to the need for creating a Research Fund of substantial proportions. Although our present, facilities permit but limited participation in research activity, important work nevertheless is in progress by members of our Staff and many notable contributions to the medical literature have been made by them. We urge you all to bear this purpose in mind so that we may be fully prepared to carry on vital research activity in the greatly expanded laboratories envisaged in our plans for expansion. Thus will we realize our ambitions to make this a real centre of modern scientific research for the benefit of humanity.

It is with deepest sorrow and regret that I record the deaths of members of our Board of Trustees and Board of Administration, which have occurred since the last Annual Meeting. The Community in general and our Hospital, in particular, suffered great loss through the passing of the late Mr. Robert Hirsch. Mr. Hirsch was associated with the Hospital from its very inception having served as Secretary of the original Building Campaign Committee and later as Secretary of the Board of Administration. At the time of his death, Mr. Hirsch was Chairman of the Board of Trustees. A man of great probity and quiet dignity we shall miss his warm and friendly influence. The Board of Trustees suffered another loss through the death of the late Mr. Louis Wolfe. Mr. Wolfe was identified with every worthwhile undertaking in our Community and gave of himself to their development. While his passing has saddened an entire Community, we in the Hospital have lost a particularly close friend, who always manifested a generous interest in all phases of the Hospital's welfare. The passing of the late Mr. Isaac Gold, has deprived our Board of Administration of one of its most devoted members. We, together with the many community causes he served so faithfully, mourn his loss.

The death of Dr. Moses Scherzer, respected member of the Pediatrics Department of our Medical Staff, is recorded with great sorrow. Dr. Scherzer distinguished himself equally as a physician and communal leader. He left a host of friends who will sorely miss him.

Dr. George Strean who has served as Chairman of the Medical Board for two terms, has relinquished the office and Dr. John Kershman has been chosen to replace him. Dr. David Berger has succeeded Dr. Max Ratner as Secretary of the Medical Board.

To the members of the Medical Board and Medical Staff we extend our grateful thanks for the contributions they have made to the professional and scientific progress of our Hospital. Although this Report cannot detail the many notable accomplishments of every Department, the achievement of one is worthy of special mention. I refer to the continued outstanding record of the Obstetrical Department, which during the year 1948, recorded 1242 births without the loss of a mother. This brought to more than 10.000 the number of consecutive births recorded over a period of 9 years with a maternal mortality of zero. So brilliant a record can be achieved only through the close cooperative effort of an entire Department. Dr. Strean and his staff deserve our commendation and we are glad of the opportunity to pay them this public tribute.

October 6th, 1948, must be recorded as a significant day in the history of our Hospital. For it was on that day the first sod was turned, symbolizing the beginning of construction of the Nurses' Residence and Training School—the first in Canada to be conducted under Jewish auspices.

Exactly one year has elapsed since that day, and we now see a magnificent structure rising to the east of the Hospital building. These buildings, scheduled for completion during the summer of 1950, will represent the most modern Residence and Training School in the entire Dominion. In keeping with the non-Sectarian policy of our Hospital, the School will be open to qualified young women of every race and creed, who will be given an opportunity to pursue a noble and honored profession. We look forward to that day, when with God's help, we may dedicate these buildings to the service of mankind and the glory of the community which made them possible.

This phase of construction constitutes but a part of our expansion program, which includes a substantial increase in bed capacity, extension of the Out-Patient Department, new Laboratories for routine and fundamental research, and generally expanded service facilities. Rapid progress made during recent years in the fields of scientific medicine and hospitalization, has compelled us to revise our plans so that all the new developments could be included and the continued growth of our services, provided for.

The revised and enlarged plan is now being finalized and construction will begin immediately after the plans have been approved.

Completion of the entire program will represent a total expenditure of approximately \$3,000,000. and that we are able to proceed with it in full is due to two factors to which I should like to make reference at this time. You will recall that at our last meeting, I reported that negotiations with the Provincial Government for a grant towards our building program were then under way. It is with deep gratification that I should like to report to you that as a result of these negotiations a generous grant has been made to us. We wish to record our profound thanks to the Honourable Mr. Duplessis, Prime Minister, to Dr. A. Paquette, Minister of Health and to the Government of the Province for their sympathetic and understanding consideration.

The late date of this Annual Meeting, permits me to refer to the second factor - the Building Completion Campaign, held during the month of May, 1949. In fact, it was this Campaign which prevented us from holding our meeting at the usual time. Encouraged and reassured by the mandate given us at a meeting of leading citizens to proceed with our full program, a Building Completion Campaign to raise the balance of funds necessary was organized. It is gratifying to report that the leadership of our Community once again rallied to our cause and a Campaign which is memorable for the effectiveness of its organization and the brilliance of the results achieved, was launched. The Hospital occupies a warm place in the hearts of the members of our Community and the generosity of their response makes it possible for us to at last proceed with the building of urgently needed additional facilities so that we may be fully adequate to meet the expanding needs of a rapidly expanding community and keep pace with the progress of medical science.

To the leaders, workers and contributors, who in this Campaign reaffirmed their interest in the future welfare of our Hospital, we record our deep and grateful thanks.

Our Women's Auxiliary, always alert to the Hospital's needs is playing an important part in our building program. The Auxiliary, which had previously made a generous contribution towards the building fund, has in addition undertaken as its special project, the furnishing of the Nurses' Residence and Training School, and it is presently engaged in a subscription Campaign towards this objective. Reports indicating the outstanding success of this venture reach me as I write this report and I am certain that when the final results are made known, it will add further to the brilliance of the Auxiliary's record. Throughout the year the Auxiliary continued to maintain and even expand its services to the Hospital. Increased enrolment of the general membership, the Life Saving Fund and the Nursery Fund, are tributes to the zeal and devotion of the officers and members in general and to the respective Chairmen of the Division in particular. To Mrs. Ezra Lozinski, President of the Auxiliary, we record our gratitude for the fine quality of leadership which she continues to give to the organization. To the Officers, Patronesses, Committee Chairmen, Board Members and to the Membership in general we extend our warm appreciation for their interest and co-operation.

To my associates on the Board of Administration, I extend my deep appreciation for their continued cooperation. To all Committees, I express my thanks for their devoted service. The Building Committee under the Chairmanship of Mr. David Kirsch has an extremely important part to play in the development and execution of our building program. The Committee is following the construction with meticulous care and I should like to record our gratitude to them for their close cooperation.

Mr. S. S. Cohen, our Superintendent, bears in addition to his administrative duties, important responsibilities in connection with the planning and construction of the new buildings. We wish to express our appreciation to Mr. Cohen for the loyal service he continues to render to the Hospital. To all Department Heads and to their staffs we convey our thanks for the manner in which they continue to discharge their respective tasks.

Mr. M. M. Sperber, KC, Honourary Legal Advisor; Mr. H. E. Herschorn, Honourary Notary; and Messrs. Mendelssohn Brothers, Customs Brokers, again rendered valuable service without fee to the Hospital and we record our sincere appreciation to them.

Our thanks are due to the Jewish Public Library, which serves our patients and to the English and Jewish Press which have co-operated splendidly with us.

In a few days the Jewish General Hospital will mark fifteen years of distinguished service to our City and Community. I think you will agree that the record achieved in these brief years is one which is a source of pride to all of us. That this record could be written is not due to the efforts of one individual or a group of individuals—it is rather the result of the combined efforts of an entire Community which has dedicated itself to this high purpose.

The new and greater Jewish General Hospital, which is now in the making will rise as an impressive monument to our Community—a Greater Tribute Everlasting to its generous and humanitarian impulses.

We dedicate ourselves to the challenging responsibilities which lie ahead and pray that the Almighty may give us wisdom and guidance so that we may be better able to serve our fellow men.

# TREASURER'S REPORT

## To the Governors of The Jewish General Hospital:

I have the honour to submit for your approval, the Report of the Treasurer, in connection with the Financial Statements for the year 1948.

Expenditures for the year totalled \$754,195.23 as compared with \$663,582. for 1947 — an increase of \$90,613.23. Revenue from Hospital operations amounted to \$601,858.15 — higher by \$90,229.99 over 1947. The Operating Deficit for the year was \$152,337.08 — an increase of \$383.24. Net non-operating income from Combined Jewish Appeal, Women's Auxiliary and other Sundry revenue totalled \$141,866.89, resulting in a net deficit of \$10,470.19.

We are gratified to note that our Endowment Fund has received some encouragement and we trust that members of our Community will continue to interest themselves in this fundamental means of protecting the future of the Hospital.

I draw your attention to the summarized Financial Statement which is before you. It contains additional detailed information of interest.

In concluding this brief Report, I should again like to pay tribute to our Community which has so loyally and generously supported the Hospital throughout the years.

We have audited the books and records of the Jewish General Hospital for the year ended 31st December, 1948 and present herewith our reports: Included herewith are the following Statements:

STATEMENT OF INCOME AND EXPENSES—HOSPITAL OPERATIONS—for the year ended 31st December, 1948.

STATEMENT OF Non-Operating Income—for the year ended 31st December, 1948.

RECONCILIATION OF CAPITAL ACCOUNT—as at 31st December, 1948.

Building Fund Accounts—for the year ended 31st December, 1948.

Vouchers for all disbursements have been duly examined and all financial transactions have been verified. Your Bankers have confirmed Bank Balances by means of certificates. Cash and Cheques on Hand have been duly verified and checked. Securities have been verified by certificate of the depositories. Inventories are shown in accordance with figures submitted by your Superintendent.

There is, in addition to liabilities shown on your Balance Sheet, a deferred liability of \$5,920.00 for expropriation taxes to the City of Montreal. This amount is payable, plus interest, in four equal instalments annually. A contingent liability in respect of the issue of \$300,000.00 of 5% serial Debentures, due 1932-1951, by the Jewish Hospital Campaign Committee Inc., and guaranteed as to principal and interest by the Government of the Province of Quebec, remains outstanding to the amount of \$65,000.00.

Your Statement of Income and Expenses on Hospital Operations for the year 1948 indicates a net operating loss of \$152,337.08.

Net Non-Operating Income for the year 1948 represented by contributions from Combined Jewish Appeal Funds, Investment Income, Donations, etc. amounted to \$141,866.89.

Subject to the foregoing, we certify that the attached statements correctly set forth the position of the Jewish General Hospital as on 31st December, 1948 and the results of the operations for the year ended 31st December, 1948 according to the best of our information and the explanations given us, and as shown by your books and records.

We desire to express our deep appreciation to your Superintendent, Mr. S. S. Cohen, to Mr. M. Segal, and to Mr. Frederick M. Goldstein, as well as to your office staff, for the kind cooperation and assistance rendered us during the course of our audit.

# REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT

Mr. Allan Bronfman, President, Jewish General Hospital.

Sir:

I have the honour to submit for your approval the Fifteenth Annual Report of the Superintendent for the year ended December 31, 1948. In the year 1948 we recorded the largest volume of service in the 15 year history of the Hospital. 5921 patients were admitted to the various Hospital divisions and they received a total of 62,728 days of care. The growth of our services can best be illustrated by the following table which shows a comparison between the years 1948, 1947 and 1939:

Since 1939 admissions increased by 35%, births by more than 65%, operations increased by 100%, X-Ray Examinations by 100% and Laboratory Examinations by more than 80%. When we consider that in 1939 we stressed the lack of adequate facilities, we begin to appreciate the great difficulties which were encountered in rendering the increased service in 1948. The statistical comparison clearly emphasizes the urgent necessity for rushing our building program to completion, so that the tremendous tension under which all Departments are compelled to operate, may be relieved and the Community better served. Meanwhile, every effort is being made to maintain efficiency and to render maximum service under difficulties referred to from year to year.

The Out-Patient Department is under particularly heavy pressure because of the greater number of patients applying for its services. In the year 1948, 5384 new patients, never previously seen in the Department were registered for treatment. A total of 36,220 visits was recorded for the year, an increase of 7,120 visits over 1947. That this increased service was carried out effectively under marked handicaps is a tribute to the medical, nursing, social service, and clerical staffs which serve this Department. To all of them we owe a debt of special gratitude.

The Tumour Clinic continues to do effective work by organized study of cases which come to its attention. The program of education was continued when Dr. Charles Huggins, Professor of Urology, University of Chicago, spoke to an audience of physicians which crowded the Lecture Hall. Dr. Huggins' Lecture was the sixth in a series of such lectures sponsored jointly by the Tumour Clinic and the Women's Auxiliary.

To the Members of the Medical Board, all of whom have cooperated faithfully, I tender my gratitude. To Dr. Geo. Strean, retiring Chairman and to Dr. John Kershman, who succeeds him, I express my deep thanks for their constant co-operation. The members of the Medical Staff continue to serve the Hospital loyally and I extend to all of them my appreciation for their patience and co-operation.

It is with a sense of genuine and profound sorrow that I record the passing of Mr. Alexander Carmichael, our Chief Engineer. Mr. Carmichael served the Hospital with uncommon devotion for 16 years and his passing was a grievous loss to us. In the death of Mr. Carmichael the Hospital lost a loyal servant and we, his associates, a good friend.

I should like to record my personal appreciation and thanks to the Department Heads, lay and professional, and to their respective staffs, for their loyalty and devotion, which in these days is often above and beyond the call of duty. Thanks are equally due to the many voluntary workers who give of their time and service to make the burdens of our staff lighter.

The Women's Auxiliary, which continues to serve every branch of the Hospital, deserves a special word of thanks. To the President, Mrs. E. Lozinski, to all her officers and to the membership at large, I wish to extend my own personal thanks for their splendid support and ever willing helpfulness.

## REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT, Continued

I know that as Governors of the Hospital, you are keenly interested in its service record and this has been presented to you at the outset of the Report. I am conscious, however, that your interests extend into the financial picture as well. While the details of the operating statement will be presented to you in the Report of the Honourary Treasurer, I should like at this time to comment on some of these details.

You will note that the cost per patient day, based on charging all operating costs to in-patients, was approximately \$11.00 per day, an increase from \$10.06 in 1947. Increased pay rolls, higher prices for fuel, food and many other supplies accounted for most of the increases, while the increased number of out-patients treated is also reflected in the higher cost per day.

It should be noted that all local Hospitals reported similar increases. Let us briefly examine why operating costs have risen from \$4.64 in 1939 to approximately \$11.00 in 1948.

Drugs — The introduction of the antibiotics and other expensive drugs has caused the Hospital's drug bill to sky rocket from an average cost of less than 20 cents per patient day in 1939, to more than \$1.50 per day in 1948.

Wages — The general acceptance of a shorter working day and the greatly increased rate of pay for employees of all categories has resulted in jumping the pay roll by more than 100%.

Supplies — Every householder knows to what extent the cost of foods, fuel, and other supplies have increased since 1939.

The total effect of the higher costs for all items which enter into the Hospital budget was to increase operating costs by more than 250%.

To be sure Hospital income has increased considerably in this period, but it has failed to keep pace with more rapidly advancing expenditures. It should be noted that during this period, room and ward rates have increased less than 50%.

Operating expenditures for 1948 totalled \$754,-195.23, while operating income was \$601,858.15, resulting in an operating deficit of \$152,337.08.

In concluding this report I should like to acknowledge with thanks the co-operation I have received throughout the year from members of our Board of Administration. To you Mr. President, I am deeply grateful for the aid and advice you so readily accorded me at all times. Your fine leadership and the meaningful direction you give to the Hospital, continue to stimulate and inspire me.

## WOMEN'S AUXILIARY

## Report of the President

FELLOW-MEMBERS:

It gives me much pleasure to present the 13th Annual Report of the Women's Auxiliary of the Jewish General Hospital including the work of its various departments. The records of previous years have been well maintained, with good progress in our major enterprises. Two new services have been added to our list of activities. One, a medical social service committee devoted to the new Canadians who come under the care of the Hospital, and second, a health education program, prepared for the benefit of the Auxiliary members and their families.

Three general meetings, seven board meetings and eight executive meetings were held during the year. The general meetings are worthy of special mention. In January 1948, the annual meeting and tea took place. The president, Mrs. Alton Goldbloom, who was retiring after serving the Auxiliary for twelve years, presented a report summarizing the work of those years. It was indeed a document to be preserved as a record of service, in its highest form. In compliment to her, the members were the guests of the officers and board at tea.

In April, Dr. Roma Gans, Professor of Education, Teachers' College, Columbia University, New York, spoke to a large audience on "Today's Children and To-morrow's Peace". The leading educationalists of Montreal were invited to attend this meeting, and tremendous interest was shown in Dr. Gans' address. which was brilliant and informative. The next general meeting in November, was of a different character. Selma Burnett Snyder of New York, actress-lecturer and creative story-teller, thrilled a very large audience with her dramatic interpretations of Leo Schwartz' book "Memoirs of my People". Her style and vibrant personality brought to life the material of Mr. Schwartz' book. We are indebted to our chairman of programs. Mrs. I. Ballon, who has given so much time and thought to arranging programs of such outstanding merit.

Another event, unprecedented in our Auxiliary history, took place on January 19th at the Mount Royal

Hotel. This was a testimonial luncheon tendered to the retiring president, Mrs. Alton Goldbloom. More than 500 gathered to pay tribute to Mrs. Goldbloom for her along and valued service to this Auxiliary. The tribute took the form of an endowment to the new school for nurses now in course of construction. The proceeds of this fund will provide an annual prize to be known as the Annie B. Goldbloom award. In addition, two presentations were made to her, a silver tray suitably engraved, from the Board of Administration, presented by Mr. Allan Bronfman, President of the Hospital, and an illuminated address on behalf of the membership by Mrs. Harry Singer, retiring vice-president of the Auxiliary. Among the guests at the head table were representatives of sister auxiliaries in Montreal, and members of the Board of Administration of the Hospital. Among those to pay tribute to Mrs. Goldbloom was Mrs. Charles Kauvar of Denver, Colorado and one of the original vice-presidents who came expressly for this event. This brilliant affair, perfect in every detail, was organized by a committee headed by Mrs. M. J. Raff, who also acted as Chairman of the luncheon.

October 6th, 1948, was a day to be marked in our recorded history for it was on that day that the long anticipated breaking of ground for the new building expansion program took place. There was no formal ceremony and the occasion was simply marked by the presence of the Board of Administration, the Medical Board, and the executive members of the Women's Auxiliary.

Bearing in mind, always, that our membership is the backbone of our organization, that income from patronesses, general membership and Children's Nursery Fund dues is the source from which all commitments are made to the Hospital, our chairmen for these departments worked constantly and indefatigably. The donations to the life-saving fund and children's nursery fund commemorating joyous occasions, and remembering departed dear ones were most gratefully received. All these contributions helped to provide the special needs

of each department. The urgency to increase our strength through membership and new patronesses cannot be emphasized too strongly. Ours is a unique organization. Except for emergency needs or special projects, to be undertaken at the request of the Board of Administration, fund raising in the accepted sense, is seldom undertaken. Our ability to meet all commitments to the Hospital depends solely on the size of our general membership and patroness group.

In keeping with our desire to further the life-saving projects, the Women's Auxiliary have sponsored a series of lectures, pertaining to cancer education and the many aspects of this baffling disease have been discussed by well known physicians and scientists who have come here to deliver lectures to our medical staff. and the profession at large in Montreal. The fifth in this series, was presented last April by Dr. Maurice Lenz, Professor of Clinical Radiology, Columbia University, New York. He also addressed the officers and executive of the Auxiliary at a small luncheon. This was a most interesting and stimulating hour. Dr. Charles Huggins, Professor of Urology, University of Chicago and eminent authority on the treatment of cancer, gave the sixth lecture in the series to the staff of our Hospital in November, but time did not permit him to address our group which he regretted exceedingly.

I have summarized briefly the highlights of the Auxiliary events of the year. As briefly as is possible in a report of this kind, I should like to give in detail, an account of each department which in providing outstanding service has helped to make the Auxiliary the valuable instrument that it is.

The total income from all departments was \$28,340.95, with a total expenditure of \$30,553.19. This represents a deficit of \$2000 which was derived from reserve funds.

Mrs. J. Block, taking over the chairmanship of the life-saving following Mrs. Allan Bronfman Sr's retirement last year, after 12 years of outstanding service, shouldered a heavy responsibility. She is proud to report that 81 new patronesses have joined our ranks in 1948, and a total of 628 paid up subscribers to the patroness group. Although the Annual patroness fee is \$25.00 seven patronesses generously contributed \$50.00 each. The total income of the Life Saving Fund was \$16,393.50. While the chief source of income was annual fees, a considerable sum was added to the fund through donations. Total expenditures from the Life Saving Fund were \$18,648.00 Included in this amount were our usual annual grants of \$2,000 for penicillin, \$1500 for vitamins, \$500 for insulin and \$500 for ins-

trument reeplacement. Special nurses, streptomycin, blood donors, plasma, oxygen, and other costly life saving measures for public ward patients accounted for approximately \$10,000 of the sum expended. In addition the Fund contributed \$1800.00 to the Tumor Clinic, for the salary of a social worker so that patients could be carefully followed during treatment. A contribution of \$1,267.50 to the Department of Haematology for Prothrombin studies and a grant of \$450, for investigation in vaginal cytology, were also made from the Life Saving Fund. It is immediately apparent that the demands on the Life Saving Fund are increasing and indeed have already exceeded our income. Much has already been accomplished, but a great deal more remains to be done. Therefore, I urge those who are not already patronesses to join this great company and receive that greatest joy of all, serving those, unable by force of circumstances to help themselves. We sincerely regret that Mrs. Block is unable to continue as chairman of the life-saving fund, and we wish to express to her our deep appreciation for her sincere efforts and service during the past year.

The membership department headed by Mrs. J. Simand, reports a total of 2,860 members in good standing. Mrs. Simand, in assuming the position of chairman previously held by Mrs. M. J. Raff, has maintained the splendid record of this department. She has worked tirelessly and enthusiastically. I am deeply indebted to her for her loyal and valuable support, her keen interest and co-operation in all matters promoting auxiliary service.

The children's nursery fund under the co-chairmanship of Mrs. J. Schulman and Mrs. J. Rubin, report a truly astonishing increase in their membership. In reporting a total of 4,706 members of which 775 are new this year, they are to be congratulated on this fine achievement. We realize the tremendous task of collection, in individual dollar bills, the membership dues, and the chairmen join me in extending their appreciation and thanks to the patronesses and board members. auxiliary members and friends who have helped to make this record possible. Nothing within the confines of this report can adequately tell the story of this organization within an organization. Mrs. Schulman and Mrs. Rubin have truly distinguished themselves by the quality of their service to the Children's wards and can well be proud of their "Child", which is fast outgrowing its swaddling clothes. They report \$250. to date in additional gift donations. The nursery fund provides all the needs of the Children's wards and layettes for the new Canadians. In addition, an annual contribution of \$450 was made to the Hospital for drugs and vitamins. We

thank our young friends of the Children's Nursery Fund for their support and feel that such a growing junior department augurs well for our future membership.

The medical library is a source of great pride to the Auxiliary. We provide medical books which are available to the medical staff and to the interns. Every good hospital should have a well stocked medical library, open at all times to its staff. The donations and grants by members and friends are used to purchase needed books and periodicals. The names of those to be honoured are inscribed in each book as a lasting tribute in memory, or for occasions of celebration. Mrs. D. Henderson, the chairman, is to be commended on her efficient manner of staffing the library with voluntary librarians, as well as cataloguing the books. A very sincere thanks to Mrs. Henderson and her committee, Miss Estelle Hecht, Mrs. David Solomon, Mrs. Edward Adeland and Mrs. Mark Goldenberg. In addition to the annual grant of \$250, from the Auxiliary the sum of \$194. was received in special gift donations. We are indebted to Dr. Gold and Dr. Braunstein for their donations of books and to Dr. Harry Ballon, Dr. M. A. Simon, Dr. Ezra Lozinski, Dr. M. N. Finkelstein, Dr. J. Monaker, and Dr. Saul Usher for their donations of periodicals. As a tribute of appreciation and esteem, on the occasion of their retirement from office, the Women's Auxiliary purchased and inscribed three books for the medical library in the names of Mrs. Allan Bronfman Sr., vice-president and chairman of the lifesaving fund 1936-48, Mrs. Harry Singer, vice-president 1936-48, and Miss Dorothy Hart for a much valued association 1938-48. Books also were inscribed honoring the names of Mr. S. S. Cohen, Superintendent of the Hospital, and Miss Amy Mendels, Superintendent of Nurses.

The departments that render special voluntary service cannot be praised too highly, their value in service to the Hospital and the community cannot be over-emphasized. The surgical dressings which are made at the hospital three afternoons a week, are under the chairmanship of Mesdames Nathan Steinberg and S. Steinberg for Mondays, M. Messinger and K. Druckman for Tuesdays and M. Levy and J. Monaker for Wednesdays. They report a total of 208,301 dressings

made with an attendance of 883. This service greatly facilitates the hospital routine and fills an important need. Our appreciation to those staunch friends who come regularly each week, and to the chairman for their devotion and supervision. The tea hour was a welcome diversion during the afternoon and the sum of \$52.00 collected in tea money was used to purchase Chanukah gifts for the children in the hospital. A special party was arranged for them at this holiday time during which toys were distributed to each child. This treat was much enjoyed by the children. After many years of faithful attendance, Mrs. Druckman and Mrs. Messinger have expressed their wish to retire from their branch of service. We know that we may count on their continued interest in Auxiliary vork. Mrs. Messinger and Mrs. Druckman may be assured of our high regard and deep appreciation of their loyalty and devotion at all times.

I should like to report in some detail on a new activity which we entered during the year. In order to meet the special need of the large number of new Canadians who required the services of the Hospital, a social service committee was organized under the capable leadership of Mrs. John Kershman. The project, inaugurated in May of last year, concerns itself primarily with maternity cases and is conducted in close co-operation with the Hospital's Social Service Department.

The aims of the Committee are:

First: An individualized approach was brought into some of the Hospital procedures. Fearful of being used as guinea pigs, afraid of a white uniform and without the knowledge of language, the reassurance by a sympathetic outsider smoothed the situation for the new arrivals and made the future seem a little brighter. Second: The care of the new baby on arrival at home. To all new, and especially young mothers, bringing the baby home is a frightening experience. For many of the new Canadians, these babies constitute the beginning of second families, the first having been exterminated. It is difficult to imagine a mother, having had children, incapable of coping with the arrival of a third or fourth child, but it is understandable also, and the fierce protectiveness soon gives way to a gently, almost scientific knowledge of baby care and routine. Vaccination, immunization, and other forms of preventive medicine are carried out under the guidance of a social service committee worker, well informed on baby care and keenly interested in the family of her protegees. Third: Continuity of surveillance of the mother, at least

until after the post partem period.

Fourth: Correlating the work of the hospital with the other social service agencies. The worker, on seeing the home situation, can evaluate the needs of the family and there the Victorian Order of Nurses in the care of the child, Jewish Family Welfare, J.I.A.S., Women's Social Service organization in supplying milk and the Council of Jewish Women in supplying clothing, have given invaluable aid. To each of the new babies, about 40 so far, this Auxiliary has presented a layette with our love and hope in its good future in our fine country.

The very able committee, who are working most diligent'y on this project, consist of Mrs. Lewis Socolow, Mrs. Henry Ungar, Mrs. David Berger, Mrs. Leon Marston, Mrs. Eugene Miller and Mrs. Harry Cohen. The various members of the committee, meet periodically to co-ordinate their contributions to the program.

Let it be said to the credit of our new Canadians that the majority of them are self-sufficient, independent, proud and mature people, with a great hope in the future. We do not want to shower them with attentions they do not desire. On the other hand, illness without friends, relatives or money, in a room in someone else's house, with the added responsibility of the new baby, can shake anyones composure. At this point I want to emphasize that for the immigrant, the housing problem is the most gigantic obstacle, although the high cost of living and the economic insecurity present no mean hardship.

A case, emphasizing the extreme pride and sensitivity of the new comer is illustrated by the following story, as told by a member of the committee. I quote. A new mother of 19, suffering from a rheumatic heart, was asked if she would care to have a Victorian Order nurse help her out for the first few days at home. "No. I don't want anyone," she replied in good English. "No thank you, I will look after my baby myself. I don't want anyone to touch her", and she became a little hysterical.

We talked of other things, her mother in Vienna and life in the camp. Before leaving, I reverted to the subject of the Victorian Order Nurse. "Are you worried about the money? Can you pay her 25 cents a day?

She looked up, tearfully and apologetically, "Oh, thank you, I would like to have her, I can afford that I think. Thank you. Yes, I was afraid of the cost."

Having a baby, thankfully, has been to most of us, a happy though anxious time. How, then can we evaluate having a baby to war-weary, camp-weary people, poor and afraid. But the almost day to day contact of the worker with the family, has given them assurance of their place in our community and incidentally, has uncovered much talent, a former brilliant ballet dancer, a musician, a charming woman who does the most exquisite leather tolling, all of which will enrich our cultural life as soon as the period of rehabilitation and readjustment is over. Our new Canadians want our sympathy in their strength not in their weakness.

The experiment has proven to be very worthwhile The program presents a tremendous challenge, but our effort will be repaid in good measure by pride in our new Canadians, their return to normal and healthy life and productivity to the nation. We congratulate Mrs. Kershman and her committee on this splendid report and their unselfish efforts on behalf of our less fortunate sisters.

A word about our health education program. It was felt that our membership would benefit by timely messages prepared and authorized by the medical board of the hospital, on conditions of health, concerning which every man and woman should be aware. The first of these pamphlets appeared on cancer, the second, on diabetis. We trust that they have merited your attention and thought. The third subject will appear in the April mailing. We have enclosed these pamphlets with our regular notices of meetings, thus saving the extra costs of mailing. The executive wished to extend their sincere thanks to the physicians who have so kindly prepared these articles.

The purchasing of linen is one of our major commitments. Previously in short supply, the past year has seen a considerable improvement in this respect. The greatly increased costs of linen together with the increased quantity purchased have placed a heavy strain on our financial resources. Mrs. A. M. Wener and Mrs. Harry Cohen, our reliable co-chairmen of linen purchasing, report an expenditure of \$7,743.92 for linens and uniforms. It is gratifying to know that patients in the hospital are well supplied with linen requirements as far as it is possible to obtain them under present conditions. Our thanks and appreciation to Mrs. Wener and Mrs. Cohen for a difficult task well done. To Mr. Jack Klein *OBE* we are more than grateful for his assistance in order placement.

Mrs. Jack Klein, chairman of layettes, supervised the purchase of the layettes, and supplied those ladies with wool who wished to knit baby garments. The needy mother is given a complete layette on leaving the hospital consisting of 2 doz. diapers, 2 sweaters, 2 bonnets, 3 pairs of booties, and 2 blankets. The demand this year has been greatly increased over previous years, and Mrs. Klein reports that 42 layettes have been given out during 1948. We appreciate the quality of Mrs. Klein's service for many years past. She has proven in numberless ways her deep interest in her department. Though relinquishing her chairmanship, we are assured of her continued interest and we extend to her our deep appreciation and thanks. We also appreciate the knitting service of the following ladies: Mrs. Max Fineberg, Mrs. J. Freudberg, Mrs. M. H. Messinger, Mrs. Sam. Held, Mrs. Sam Steinberg and Mrs. I. Cohen.

The clerical department has been a tower of strength to this organization. The meticulous attention to the business end of this large enterprise has been capably and efficiently executed by Mrs. S. Gasco and Mrs. B. Cohen. Every emergency and commitment received their prompt attention. Our thanks and appreciation are extended to them.

The chairman of publicity, Mrs. William Deskin, arranged for advance notices of meetings in the daily press. To Mrs. Deskin may I say that her efforts have been more than appreciated by myself and the committee. We regret that circumstances do not permit her to continue this work for which she is so admirably fitted. We hope that in the not too distant future she will resume an active roll in the Auxiliary.

Our treasurer, Mrs. S. Hershon and our financial secretary Mrs. J. Rubin, merit a very special mention. The large membership to be accounted for and the heavy duties of the treasurer, together, form a most important service. Both Mrs. Hershon and Mrs. Rubin are well equipped for their respective positions. We are fully aware and appreciate the time and concentration required in this branch of our work.

Our secretaries, Mrs. George Strean, Mrs. Z. I. Diner and Mrs. Sydney Lithwick have won our admiration and esteem for their faithful and devoted attention to their respective duties. Mrs. Strean has written, for various occasions, 119 letters, besides assisting in many other capacities. She is responsible for hotel arrangements for our general meetings. Mrs. Diner prepared all notices for general meetings and attended to the details of printing, a not inconsiderable task when we realize the size of our membership; while accurate and concise minutes have been taken by Mrs. Lithwick. Our very deep appreciation to them, for a much valued service.

The hospitality co-chairmen, Mrs. Allan Bronfman Jr., Mrs. S. Held and Mrs. A. Schachter, arranged for a successful tea at the last annual meeting in January and also arranged for hospitality extended to our visiting guest speakers during the year.

The special service and car committee, under the co-chairmanship of Mrs. J. Carin and Mrs. N. Dobrin, provided cars for needy patients in emergencies, also securing cars to aid in the collection of nursery fund dues when necessary. We wish to thank the following patronesses and members for generously putting their cars at our disposal: Mrs. L. L. Sperber, Mrs. A. C. Benjamin, Mrs. J. Richer, Mrs. S. Ross Vineberg, Mrs. Sol Friedman and Mrs. M. Star, and the chairmen for a much valued co-ordination of this service. Mrs. Carin, we regret, will be unable to resume her chairmanship this year. We are most grateful for the time and attention given to her department.

Our reliable chairman of telephone, Mrs. Ned Gross and of attendance records, Mrs. H. Levine, have given faithful and devoted service. To all these ladies, I wish to extend a very hearty thank you. They may be regarded as the women behind the scenes, receiving no glory other than a feeling of work well done. In expressing thanks to our chairmen, I wish to thank particularly, Mrs. B. Wigdor, who undertook the chairmanship for the nominating committee. Always a difficult assignment, Mrs. Wigdor discharged her duties efficiently and well.

We wish to record our thanks and appreciation to the press, the Montreal Star, the Gazette, the Jewish Daily Eagle, the Herald, the Westmount Examiner, the Monitor, the Montreal Standard, the Canadian Jewish Review, the Jewish Standard, the Canadian Jewish Chronicle, and the Town Crier on Station CJAD, for assisting us in our work by publicizing our meetings, and their courtesy at all times.

The Canadian Jewish Standard featured an article by Mrs. M. J. Raff in the New Year's edition, on the Women's Auxiliary of the Jewish General Hospital. We wish to express to her our appreciation for this excellent article. In fine descriptive style, Mrs. Raff gives a full analysis of Auxiliary work during the years of its development. The editors of the Standard received letters of acknowledgment and appreciation from Princess Alice of Athlone and Lady Alexander of Tunis, our Honorary Patronesses whose visits to the hospital were featured in the article.

To members of the Executive board, who do such magnificent work and make possible the aid we give to the hospital, we say thank you in very great measure. Though your task may appear to be a thankless one, it does not go unnoticed, its true value is fully recognized and appreciated.

Mr. S. S. Cohen, Superintendent of the Hospital, has always been of great assistance to us, and more particularly to myself, whose needs in this first year of office may well be understood. His wise guidance, patience and understanding of our more troublesome problems has done much to facilitate my work.

We wish to express to the Distillers Seagram Corporation, our gratitude for their continued kindness in affording us the facilities of their offices during fee collection.

Once again, we extend to our honorary accountants, Messrs. I. Blackman and Co. our appreciation of their services.

During the past year, many of our members have suffered bereavement. We take this opportunity of expressing to them, our deep sympathy in their sorrow.

To those modest people who help out in every emergency, by relieving a shortage in dining-room service, assisting in canning of food from our gardens, or in any form whatsoever inside or outside of our organization our gratitude and regard.

I cannot conclude this report without extending my personal thanks to each and everyone of the officers

and members of the executive committee. Their kindness and encouragement to me, their advice and help whenever called for and often given voluntarily have given me a sense of security and support without which my task would have been burdensome indeed. I would like to mention, also, the members of the executive council, who at all times gave me the benefit of their long experience with sound advice and counsel, particularly may I mention Mrs. Goldbloom, Honorary President, and Mrs. Allan Bronfman Sr., Honorary Vicepresident, who advised and assisted me whenever called upon. Mrs. D. Tannenbaum, though a member of the executive council has continued up to the present to give of her time and talents in keeping the records of donations to the life saving fund and writing the letters of acknowledgment. Mrs. Tannenbaum, we can be assured, will continue her interest in all matters pertaining to our work, though obliged to relinquish this position. We feel that we are indeed fortunate to have the continued benefit of her wise counsel.

In gathering the material for this annual report and drawing the threads of all services into orderly sequence, I was struck by the fact that a distinct pattern was achieved, a tapestry of noble proportions and design came to life for me; on it was pictured, not departments and services, but living people, who through the unselfish efforts and tireless work of those responsible for the whole structure of hospitalization have been enabled to return to the world, once more, with regained health and spirit. As the pattern of our work came to life for me, I hope that you will visualize it in this way, in its real sense, not merely as a statistical record of material purchased and monies spent.

As another year of Auxiliary endeavour is about to begin, let us dedicate ourselves, once again, to this noble work, with each of us in our own way, contributing in even greater measure to the usefulness of the hospital, and indispensable part of this community. May I conclude this report with a quotation from the Talmud, "He who saves one life is considered as if he had preserved the whole world".
