SUMMARY:

The division has Allergy Clinic 4 days a week and a consult service. The Division has established a Drug Allergy Screening Program with Preoperative Screening Service, Hematology-Oncology and dialysis. The Division supervises desensitization to chemotherapy and biologics. The division holds weekly combined rounds with Rheumatology Immunology rounds on Tuesday afternoons from 3:30 to 5:00 PM. There is an Allergy and Immunology Journal Club every Friday morning at the Montreal General Hospital.

1. Clinical activities, research and publications:

The Division has organized the following clinical activities: an Allergy Clinic, 4 days a week, an Adverse Reaction Clinic as well as a clinic to evaluate immune disorders such as immune deficiency and auto immune diseases. There are 6,250 out-patient visits per year at the allergy clinic.

Services offered include: Skin testing for allergies, blood testing for allergies, food challenges, drug challenges, drug desensitization, and allergy shots (immunotherapy)

Clinic Hours are: Monday 8:00 a.m.- 4:00 p.m.; Tuesday 8:00 a.m.- 4:00 p.m.; Wednesday 8:00 a.m.- 4:00 p.m.; Thursday 8:00 a.m.- 4:00 p.m.

Allergy and Immunology provides consultation for allergic diseases including asthma, rhinitis, sinusitis, skin disorders and food and drug allergy. The Division provides coverage for the inpatient Hematology-Oncology unit as well as K7.

2. Teaching and learning (undergraduate and graduate):

Teaching includes attending on the CTU, office teaching with residents and students, small group teaching, lectures within the Department and outside the Department including McGill University, participation in the undergraduate teaching program in Immunology at McGill, the Thursday night lecture series at the Medical School and a number of teaching programs both at the provincial and national level. The Division receives 6-7 residents on a monthly basis and fellows in Allergy on a regular basis.

Total teaching hours: OPD: 100, Consults: 50

3. Involvement in the community:

This includes serving as Co-Director, National Guidelines for Upper Airway Diseases, sponsored by the Canadian Society of Allergy and Clinical Immunology and the Canadian Otolaryngology Society and participation in many symposia, and other educational forms specifically, involving Rhinosinusitis in the development of Canadian guidelines in this area and involvement in multiple seminars with both specialists and

family physicians in the area of allergy and clinical immunology. Dr. Silviu-Dan is chair of the Royal College Committee for Clinical Immunology and Allergy.

4. Partnerships:

Besides the activities mentioned under “Involvement in the community,” the Division participates in teaching and research activities with the Divisions of Rheumatology in the Department of Medicine and the Ear Nose and Throat Division in the Department of Surgery.

5. Milestones: New hires, promotions, and retirements:

Dr. Jesse Schwartz started with the department in July, 2018.
