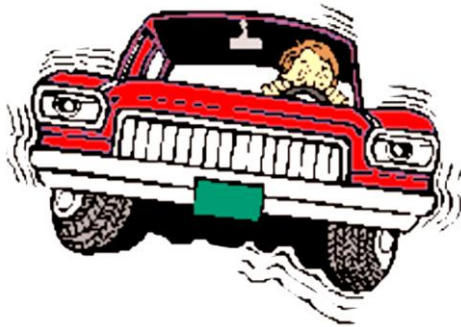

The complete assessment includes:

 **2 sessions** (90 minutes each) with an occupational therapist to complete:

- A consent form for the evaluation
- An interview about the driving history and habits of the driver
- Four to six paper-and-pen tests
- Two to three computerized tests
- Payment in cash for the road test


 **A road test (1 to 2 hours):**


- With a driving instructor and the occupational therapist
- In a driving school's car
- Monetary compensation paid in advance (the amount may vary depending on the driving school available)
- Cancellations are permitted 48 hours before the appointment


 **And if needed:**


- One session to explain results and discuss recommendations
- Screening tests alone may be administered


For the assessment to take place:

 A health care professional must fill out the ICFP referral sheet

 The referral can be placed in R. Ibrahim's mailbox at the ICFP

 The person referred must have an open file in the JGH Psychiatry Department and be informed of the referral and cost involved.

 Clients with identified visual or neurological / physical problems that may interfere with driving should be referred to the Constance Lethbridge Rehabilitation Center.

 For an assessment including a road test, clients should be considered stable by the referring professional.
